rant for this amount or what ever we desired to donate. Stating in other cases, for instance the New Orleans Levee Board which had overdrawn this appropriation by some seventy-five or a hundred dollars, and they proceeded in this manner to ask for a refund in order to get in bonds for that year. I told him the Board was under the impression that each year stood for itself and that the \$1,000.00 was for 1915, and that 1916 would also stand for itself. But the fiscal year begins on the first of July, and we should stay in the bounds during that time.

By Mr. Kell: I move that the matter be taken up with Mr. Fox to have a refund of amount of overdraft of the allotted appropriation with the understanding that out of the coming year beginning July 1st, a like amount be returned to it.

(This motion was seconded by Mr. Young, and was carried.)

A motion by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Hamley, that the President on request of the Government Engineer be allowed to secure right of way of canal along enlargement from Station O to Bayou Roundaway, was carried.

On motion of Mr. Young, the Board adjourned.

**MAY TAKE A HAND IN DISTRICT FIGHT.**

**Executive Action Deemed Necessary To Quiet Levee Board Upheaval.**

Tallulah, La., June 3.—An upheaval in the internal affairs of the Fifth District Levee Board, and a senatorial personal clash between Robert Hill and E. J. Hamley, members from East Carroll, at the special meeting of the Board held here Wednesday, will probably bring the matter of reorganization of this Board to the attention of Gov. Pleasant at an early date.

The differences between Mr. Hill and Mr. Hamley have been known for some time. Mr. Hill, it will be recalled, resigned during the latter part of Gov. Hall's administration, saying he could not remain a member, throwing out veiled charges of a most sensational manner.

Gov. Hall declined to accept the Hill resignation, and instead insisted upon him making specific charges, if there had been any one at fault or any warrant for the intimations. The matter dragged along and the recent high water fight came on.

Mr. Hill and Mr. Hamley, as was the custom, divided the East Carroll territory, Mr. Hamley taking that above and Mr. Hill that to the South. This battle against flood being over, the bills of expenditures from the several parishes and from the designated districts showed a wide variance, although there were no intimation that anything was wrong.

Wednesday's meeting was for the settlement of the flood bills and to consider the charges of Mr. Hill, which were still hanging fire. The expense for the East Carroll Division showed a total of \$22,000, of which amount Mr. Hamley had expended about \$15,000 in his territory, and Mr. Hill about \$7,000 in his.


When the Board assembled, Mr. Hill proceeded to read a lengthy statement, covering more than a dozen typewritten pages, most of which were aimed at his "fellow member," meaning Mr. Hamley. It was charged that money had been spent recklessly in the purchase of lumber, boats and equipment for fighting the flood.

Friends of Mr. Hamley say the charges are ridiculous, and that his results speak for themselves.

After Mr. Hill had finished reading his exhortation, Mr. Hamley is said to have asked that the young woman stenographer be sent from the room, whereupon he denounced the Hill charges as a "lie" and applied accompanying epithets.

The two men rushed at each other and clinched. It required the combined efforts of several members of the Board to separate them.

The affair has been a sensation in this entire district for several days, although every effort has been made to quiet it down.



## RESOLUTION FIFTH LOUISIANA LEEVE BOARD.

At a meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Fifth Louisiana Levee District, on May 31, 1916, the following Resolution was offered by Commissioner T. P. Kell, seconded by B. P. Young and was unanimously adopted, to-wit:

WHEREAS in the opinion of this Board a bond issue not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 additional to the bond issues authorized by Section 12 of Act No. 44 of 1886, and by Act No. 134 of the General Assembly of Louisiana, Session of 1912, is imperatively necessary in order to enable this Levee District to pay its pro rata for the levee work to be done in the Fifth Louisiana Levee District, under the terms of the Flood Control Committee bill now pending in the Congress of the United States, therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED, that public notice is hereby given of the intention of the Board to apply to the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, now in session, for the passage of an act to authorize the Board of Commissioners of the Fifth Louisiana Levee District to issue and negotiate bonds not to exceed One Million Dollars, additional to the bond issues authorized by Section 12 of Act No. 44 of 1886, and by Act No. 134 of the General Assembly of Louisiana, session of 1912.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that this notice of intention to apply for the passage of such an act shall be published in the East Carroll-Banner Democrat, the Madison Journal, the Tennessee Gazette, and the Concordia Sentinel, (weekly newspapers published in this District) for thirty days as required by Article 60 of the Constitution of this State.
