**IMPORTED CATTLE NEED
CAREFUL ATTENTION**

TEXAS CATTLE ACUSTOMED TO HIGHER ALTITUDE AND DIFFERENT FEED.

DRY FEED IS ESSENTIAL

These Cattle Will Do Well in Louisiana if Handled Properly.

Success or failure with the thousands of head of Texas cattle that have been brought into Louisiana will largely depend on the methods of handling they receive for the first six to twelve months. They come from a higher altitude and a country of much lighter rainfall. They have lived on dry, strong grass, which contains much less water per 100 pounds than do the grasses of their new pastures.

The change is certain to affect them and the succulent grasses will probably cause looseness of the bowels. They must be carefully handled during the period of acclimatization, or serious damage may result. Young stock (yearlings and calves) will usually suffer less than older animals.

Careful attention is particularly necessary with the cattle which are being moved from Texas this fall. Winter upon us, and the winter season, even in the South, makes feeding necessary, even with native stock. This is still more true with the Texas cattle which are spending their first winter in the State. To lessen the severity of acclimatization, plenty of dry feed, such as hay, straw, stover, or access to corn stalk and velvet bean fields, should be given. When spring comes on, the cattle should not be forced to subsist at once on grass alone, but should be given some such dry feed in addition.

Young cattle should by all means receive good care. They should get plenty of dry roughage and some concentrate in addition in order that they may develop well. One pound of cotton seed meal or two to two and one-half pounds of velvet beans or velvet bean meal daily, with plenty of hay, should carry them through in good condition.

With an abundance of hay, straw or corn stover, native cows can be wintered well with the addition of one-half to one pound of cotton seed meal or two to three pounds of velvet beans or velvet bean meal.

Farmers whose pastures are still ticky, and who have bought Texas cattle from below the quarantine line, will do well to keep "the ticks off these cattle. They are tick free when received, or shortly thereafter, having had two dippings. Why, then, allow them to become reinfested?

In all cases, remember that Louisiana is a good cattle state. Cattle will do well here if properly handled. If good cattle are brought in from Texas or elsewhere and they do not do well, do not be in a hurry to blame the cattle. Make sure first that the trouble is not with improper feeding, tick infestation or some cause for which the owner is to blame, and not really the cattle themselves.—Live Stock Extension Service, Louisiana State University.

BEGINNERS SHOULD NOT OVERSTOCK

There is a tendency on the part of beginners in live stock husbandry to overstock before being possessed of the requisite knowledge of how to proceed successfully in this line of farming practice," says W. H. Dalrymple, of the Louisiana State University.

"The successful raising of live stock may be considered a specialty, and those who would succeed should begin in a relatively small way and increase the number of their animals as they themselves gain in knowledge and experience.

"In the case of hogs, for example, this applies in a very pronounced manner, and the error of overstocking with brood-sows is more likely to occur than in the case of any other animals of the farm.

"The production of hogs at this time is extremely important, and yet the beginner with too many sows may not succeed nearly so well, in the ultimate outcome, as the man who makes a reasonably small beginning and grows up with the business.

"Hogs, under ordinary conditions, are very prolific animals, and their natural increase would be liable to overwhelm the beginner who was not familiar with their necessary requirements for best results. The hog owner must always consider the possibility of disease attacking his herd, and he must likewise be ever on the alert to see that food provision is made for the increasing number of animals. In short, the farmer must be familiar with the principal details of the business before it is safe for him to undertake hog raising on a large scale; and the more intelligent and safer way for him to proceed would be to procure a few sows only, and a male animal, and gradually increase his breeding stock as his information increases and he knows how to profitably manage a maximum herd."
