

HAS A BIG JOB

G. S. Bilheimer of Denver, Colo., has been appointed Southern department campaign director for the next big drive for funds to continue the war work being done by the Red Triangle forces in the army camps of the United States and overseas, army Y. M. C. A., the Y. W. C. A., the War Camp Community Service, the Salvation Army, the National Catholic War Council, the American Library association and the Jewish Welfare board.

Mr. Bilheimer is one of the foremost men in the Y. M. C. A. movement. He is a member of the international committee of the organization, a member of the National War Work council and a master organizer and executive. He successfully directed the last army Y. M. C. A. drive for the Southern department, comprised of Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Arizona and New Mexico, and was unanimously chosen for the larger responsibility of the approaching campaign, during which the country will be called upon to support the Y. M. C. A. and other important war work agencies.

Mr. Bilheimer will be located at Dallas during the campaign period. He will have an able corps of assistants and specialists on his staff to carry out the various activities connected with a campaign of the magnitude of the forthcoming financial drive.

Mr. Bilheimer was chosen to direct the entire United War Work campaign for funds to finance the work of the seven war work agencies because of his successful experience and his unusual ability. His selection came direct from the New York headquarters of the consolidated campaign, with the solid approval of the people of the six southwestern states, who are under his leadership, to furnish their part of the \$170,500,000 which the nation will be called on to contribute between November 11 and 14.

Next: Dry these nuts in ovens or in the sun. Bring them to the nearest Red Cross collecting station. The Red Cross is to have general charge. The Gas Defense Division, 19 West 44th Street, New York, N. Y., will answer further question.

## RULES FOR SENDERS HOLIDAY GIFTS TO OUR BOYS—OVER THERE

Washington, Oct. 15.—Of course you want your boy "over there" to have a merry Christmas. You want him to have "something from home."

In order that Santa Claus may visit your boy in France, however, you must comply with the carefully drawn regulations which it has been necessary for the army and the Postoffice Department to impose in order that every man have a chance at a Christmas box and still keep the volume of such gifts within a limit that would not clog and hamper our war transportation.

The following rules must be strictly followed. Better cut them out and keep them for reference:

1. Only one Christmas parcel may be sent to any man serving in the A. E. F.
2. This parcel must be of standard size, 24x18 inches, and must not exceed three pounds in weight.
3. Parcels can be sent only by persons who present a "Christmas parcel label," received from the soldier to whom the parcel is to be sent. These labels will be distributed to the men overseas, one to each man, and will be forwarded by them to the person who is to send the Christmas box.
4. Parcels must not contain articles ordinarily unobtainable nor perishable foodstuffs.

Cartons of the size prescribed may be obtained from any local Red Cross chapter. After they have been filled they must be returned to a Red Cross receiving station, where inspectors will examine them to see they are properly packed and wrapped, and will affix the Christmas parcel label. Each parcel then will be sealed and a certificate of inspection attached, which will prevent later examination by postoffice officials. Parcels should be left with the Red Cross for mailing.

Postage will be charged at the regular parcel post rates from point of sending to Hoboken, N. J. Brief Christmas greetings, such as "Merry Christmas," "From Santa Claus," "Don't open till Christmas," etc., may be inscribed on the boxes, and each parcel must bear the name and address of the sender.

In order that Christmas parcels may be certain of delivery by Dec. 25, they should be mailed not later than Nov. 20. The task of transportation and of delivery on the other side cannot be handled in less than one month. For boys in the navy, where the number of men to be served and where the transportation question involved is not so heavy, there is no limit to the number of Christmas parcels they may receive and the weight limit of any one parcel is 20 pounds, instead of three for the army.

Substantial boxes or other containers should be used, and should be of a sort and so packed as to permit ready examination. The name and address of the sender should be in upper left hand corner and the address should follow the following form:

1. Full name of addressee, with his rank of rating.
2. The vessel, station or naval base to which he is attached.
3. "Care supply officer, fleet supply base, 22d St. and Third St., Bank Terminal Station, Brooklyn, N. Y."

Navy Christmas parcels should be mailed not later than Nov. 15.
