

SWAT THE FLY



THE FLY WILL SWAT YOU

BEWARE OF THE PESTIFEROUS HOUSE-FLY.

Wherever He Goes Death and Disease May Follow.

War to the death should be declared upon the little pest. His presence is a disgrace. If there is no dirt and filth there will be no flies. Keep the flies away from the milk. Don't allow flies in your house. Don't buy food stuff where flies are tolerated. Don't let flies crawl over the baby's face or hands. Don't let flies come near baby's food or nursing bottle.

Clean up your premises inside and out, then see that others do the same. Strike at the root of the evil. The housefly breeds in horse manure, kitchen offal, and the like. Dispose of these materials in such a way that the housefly cannot propagate. Screen all windows and doors and insist that your grocer, butcher, baker and everyone from whom you buy food stuffs does the same. There is more health in a well screened house than many a doctor's visit.

Put in Your Screens.

The fly season will soon be here, and those who put in their screens promptly will be taking the best of precaution against the insidious fly.

Chicago's Board of Health says:

"Fly screens are recognized by the health department as one of the most efficient preventive and sanitary measures. They should be put in place early in fly time, and used continuously until the snow flies. Keep the common housefly out of your house and away from your food."

"Screen your windows. Begin now in your warfare against flies. You cannot begin too soon."

The season of the year has arrived when it becomes the duty of every American to stop the fly and keep him out, or if he gets in to swat him.

A little pamphlet written by the Anti Fly Crusade of Detroit, while it contains many statements scarcely suitable for breakfast table perusal, deserves a wide circulation for its portrayal of the evils that follow in the train of the fly. The indictment is a lengthy one, but it is a true bill. The fly is put in the same class with the mad dog, the snake in the grass and the wild animal roaming at will, for the fly is insidious. He lurks in every corner. He plants his germs on your bread. He buries them in your butter. He floats them on your baby's milk bottle. There is no escape if he once enters your home. The lesson is obvious; keep the fly out; put your screen in early.

Suggestions for Fly Time.

Screen early. Screen and swat. Keep the first fly out. Don't buy food stuffs where flies are tolerated.

Don't eat where flies have access to the food. Do not patronize grocery stores and markets that harbor and feed flies. Insist upon screens.

"Fruit a la filth"—the kind served from sidewalk stands after being exposed to street dirt and flies.

Screens on windows and doors to keep out flies will do more to safeguard your treasures than will locks to keep out burglars.

With all houses well sewered and screened, the flies that feed upon filth and kitchen refuse would largely disappear and health conditions would be to that extent improved. Screen all windows and doors, especially the kitchen and dining room.
