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RELIGIOUS FORCES INTRODUCE DRASTIC SUNDAY BILL INTO CONGRESS.

A new compulsory Sunday observance bill was recently introduced into Congress by Congressman Fitzgerald of Ohio, at the instigation of the Lord's Day Alliance, The National Reform Association, the Methodist Board of Temperance and Moral Reform, and the Pastor's Federation of Washington, D. C. This is the third compulsory observance measure introduced into Congress during this session. This bill is the long promised Sunday measure put forth by the Sunday law advocates which is to close up everything tight on Sunday in the District of Columbia, and is to serve as a model for the whole nation. It forbids all kinds of work except household service on Sunday. In the first section of the bill it excepts work of "necessity and charity," but in the third section it limits even works of "necessity and charity" to six days of the week. If an individual or a firm allow works of necessity or charity on Sunday, they must then provide a succeeding twenty-four hour day of rest for each offender.

No exemptions are made for those who religiously observe another day than Sunday. Those who can afford to be idle two days in the week may fare well enough, but no provision is made for those who need to work six days in the week for daily bread. Some have questioned why God made the tonsils and appendix, as they so frequently have to be removed; now it would seem that the conscience of man is to become an anatomy since these so-called reformers plan its removal in such a wholesale manner.

The bill specifically closes on Sunday all "places of public assembly or amusement for secular purposes," and also "unlawful sports," but does not say what unlawful sports, already prohibited by law, are to become extinct with the passage of this drastic Sunday law. Later on they may even see to it that the moonshine factory becomes "still" on Sunday. A penalty of from \$5.00 to \$500.00 with up to six months in jail, is provided for the violation of any of its prohibitions.

Every lover of God-given and Constitutional rights to worship God in accordance with the dictates of his own conscience, should send in a vigorous protest against these encroachments upon freedom of conscience. Every community should send in to Congress well signed petitions opposing this measure.

The Religious Liberty Association, and the Anti-Blue Law League of America are planning to meet the issue with a vigorous opposition campaign. Religious legislation of this nature should be turned down with an overwhelming defeat. Human rights and religious liberty are in danger.

Whereas there is a nation-wide effort being put forth by certain religious organizations to Puritanize America, and to revive the Sunday Blue Laws of Colonial times when the church and state were united, therefore be it

Resolved: That we, citizens of _____, do hereby petition the United States Senate, and the United States Congress not to pass any compulsory Sunday observance bills. We are opposed to the Sunday blue laws because they are religious in character and contrary to the fundamental principles of the American system of government, in violation of the American principles of the separation of church and state, and above all they are manifestly un-American, un-Christian, unconstitutional, partial, and a piece of pure class legislation favoring certain sects and discounting others under duress of civil laws. Religious legislation unchecked, knows no limitations and no mercy. The last step in that direction is the Inquisition with all the horrors that bigots can invent. It is therefore necessary that we take alarm and raise our voices in protest against the first step heading in that direction and the first encroachments upon our liberties. God made the conscience free in the realm of religion and no man have a right to enslave it.

Civil laws and carnal weapons were not employed to advance His cause. The church should employ only gospel means to advance the cause of religion. Let America be the home of freedom, an asylum for the oppressed, the dispenser of equal justice, the defender of the individual conscience and cradle of liberty for all men of every religion and no religion as long as they do not encroach upon the same equal privileges and rights of their fellowmen.
