

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE DEMOCRATIC STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF LOUISIANA, AT MEETINGS HELD AT HOTEL GRUNEWALD, CITY OF NEW ORLEANS, MON. AND TUES. MAR. 13 AND 14, 1922.

Authorizing Democratic Municipal Primaries.

Resolution No. 1, by Philip S. Pugh. Whereas, the Supreme Court of Louisiana has decided that no names can be placed upon a municipal ballot used at a general election, whenever the persons named are registered as affiliated with the Democratic party, unless said persons be duly nominated at a primary regularly held, Be It Resolved, that the Democratic State Central Committee does hereby authorize, empower and direct all Democratic Parish Committees to hereafter call and direct municipal primaries in municipalities having no Democratic Executive Committee.

Be It Further Resolved, that Parish Democratic Executive Committees shall, at the time of ordering such primaries, provide for the election of Democratic Municipal Executive Committees to be composed of five (5) members, which committees shall assume all duties connected with municipal primaries, after having been duly elected, or declared elected without opposition in accordance with Section 28 of the Primary Law.

Be It Further Resolved, that all duly elected Democratic Municipal Committees, now exercising the powers and fulfilling the duties imposed on them, whether consisting of five members or of some other number, may continue their succession by electing such number of committee-men as now constitute said committees or may fix the number hereafter to be elected of five members as above provided.

Be It Further Resolved, that a copy of these regulations be forwarded to each Democratic Parish Executive Committee to be in turn transmitted to Democratic Municipal Executive Committees now or hereafter to be formed.

Qualifications For Voting.

Resolution No. 2, by Judge I. D. Moore, Chairman of Sub-Committee. Acting under and by virtue of Section 4 of Article 8 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1921, It is Hereby Resolved, by the Democratic State Central Committee, that no person shall vote at any primary election held by the Democratic party for the purpose of nominating any candidate for any public office, unless he possesses the following qualifications:

First: He shall, be at the time he offers to vote a registered voter.
Second: He must be a white person.
Third: He must not, at the time he offers to vote, be associated with or an adherent of any organization, association or party opposed to the Democratic party or which teaches any doctrines inconsistent with those of the Democratic party or inimical to the Constitution of the State of Louisiana or of the United States of America.

Fourth: He shall, at the time he offers to vote, possess all of the qualifications of residence and payment of poll tax required by the Constitution.

And no person shall become a candidate in any such primary, unless he shall first have made application to the Democratic Committee calling such primary, accompanied by his affidavit stating that he possesses all of the qualifications above prescribed, and no Committee shall in any wise certify any person as a candidate for nomination by, or as the nominee, of, the Democratic party, unless he has filed such application and such affidavit and possesses all such qualifications.

Senatorial And Judicial Primaries.

Resolution No. 3, By N. H. Nunes. Be It Resolved, by the Democratic State Central Committee for the State of Louisiana, that hereafter all senatorial and judicial committees shall be composed of nine members to be chosen from the different parishes composing the said districts in proportion, to population, provided that in all instances each parish shall be entitled to at least one representative, said members of such senatorial and judicial committees to be elected at the next general primary held in the

said senatorial and judicial districts. Be It Further Resolved, that pending said election in all senatorial and judicial districts, where changes have been made by the Constitution of 1921, the said committee shall be composed of the members of the State Central Committee of the Parishes comprised within said senatorial or judicial district, together with the Chairman of each Parish Committee of each parish within the said senatorial and judicial district.

Be It Further Resolved, that in the Parish of Orleans where changes have been made by the Constitution of 1921, in reference to senatorial districts, that the Orleans Parish Democratic Committee shall exercise full power and authority at all times. Be It Further Resolved, that any vacancy occurring on either of the said two committees shall be filled by the remaining members of the committees.

Eligibility of Candidates.

Resolution No. 4, by Judge I. D. Moore. We recommended that the Legislature be requested to revise the Primary Election Law to meet the provisions of the Constitution and to carry out the intent of Section 4, Article 8, of the Constitution of 1921, and make such changes in the procedure by which the eligibility of candidates shall be determined as to save unnecessary expense of primaries which may be held invalid.

We further recommend that the Primary Law be amended so that committees may determine in certain instances the advisability of method of nomination other than by primary, particularly in small municipalities.

States Board of Education.

Resolution No. 5, by John C. Davey. Be It Resolved, by the Democratic State Central Committee, that the Executive Committee be empowered and authorized to call any primary election for members of the State Board of Education or for the election of any other officials, made necessary by the Constitution of 1921.

Committee on Amendments.

Resolution No. 6, by U. P. Brezause. That the chair is hereby authorized to appoint a committee of seven lawyers, either from within or without the membership of this committee, with the chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee as ex-officio a member, to prepare such amendments to the primary law as have been suggested by the resolutions of this committee, including the suggested amendment to give the members elected from the parishes, and wards of the city of New Orleans, the right to elect all members at large, and repealing the provisions of the primary law which now makes them elected from congressional districts. The district lines, however, to be observed so that three members at large shall be selected from each district.

We, the chairman and secretary, hereby certify that the above and foregoing resolutions are true and correct copies of the originals unanimously adopted by the Democratic State Central Committee of Louisiana, at its meetings held in the city of New Orleans, La., Monday and Tuesday, March 13 and 14, A. D. 1922.

Office Board of Commissioners Fifth Louisiana Levee District, Tallulah, La., March 27th, 1922.

The Board of Commissioners for the Fifth Louisiana Levee District met in special called session by its President, to consider the ways and means of high water protection and to consider especially the offer of the U. S. Government Engineers to take charge of the East Carroll Levee line, conditioned on this Board contributing the sum of \$20,000.00, to pay for the expenses.

\$20,000.00, to the U. S. Government Engineers of the 3rd District to furnish patrols and equipment to take charge of the East Carroll Levee during the present high water fight, was taken up and considered and upon advice of the Attorney of this Board, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That under the law governing the distribution of funds for Flood Control does not permit the Board to contribute funds for other purposes than defined in the Flood Control Act of Congress, namely the construction of levees in the district.

On motion of Commissioner Young, seconded by Commissioner Neal, that the loan of F. D. Galanty made this Board for \$7,000.00, be increased to \$10,000.00, and that when the balance of \$2,500.00 be paid by Galanty that the president be authorized to make a new certificate of indebtedness for said amount \$10,000.00, and to pay the interest due on the original amount \$7,500.00. Said loan to be for the period of one year.
