SEA-PLANE "DE SOTO" FLIES HERE IN TWO HOURS THIS MORNING.

The commercial hydroplane "De Soto" arrived here this morning at 11:45 o'clock and after circling the city, slowly glided to the surface of the canal in front of the Y. and M. V. passenger station where the sea-bird will remain during the stay in this city.

The plane in charge of Capt. T. A. Townsend, with Mrs. Townsend, came from Baton Rouge this morning, making the trip in two hours and leaving a sister plane in the Louisiana city. The distance is over 125 miles.

While here, passengers will be taken up for a flight and if a sufficient number apply, the plane will stay here tomorrow, otherwise it will hop off for Greenville in the morning.

Our citizens are perfectly familiar with the peculiar hum of an airplane motor now and as soon as the "De Soto's" was heard, the streets and windows were filled with interested spectators admiring the graceful landing of the huge white man-made bird.


