FIFTH DISTRICT LEVEE BOARD.
Regular Meetings, Second Wednesdays in January, April and October, at Tallulah, Louisiana

PROCEEDINGS LEVEE BOARD

The Board of Commissioners of the Fifth Louisiana Levee District met in regular session at its domicile, Tallulah, La., on this day. The Board was called to order by the President at 10:30 o'clock and the roll of members was called, there being present and answering their names the following:

F. H. Schneider, President, and Leo Shields, East Carroll Parish.
R. K. Bonay and A. E. Kell, Madison Parish.

S. T. Shaw, Texas Parish.
J. H. Lambdin and J. D. Neal, Concordia Parish.

Absent: B. F. Young, Tensas.

A quorum being present, the regular business was taken up, as follows: Reading of minutes of previous meeting was dispensed with. On motion, duly seconded, communications, reports of President and Secretary were read and filed.

Communication from Judge John Dale, relative to the extension of levee in lower Concordia Parish was read, but no action taken at this time.

The President reported that the Committee appointed to meet the U. S. Fourth District Engineer, at New Orleans, relative to getting the Government to take care of the situation at Deer Park, by revetting the bank, discussed the matter with Major C. E. Engineer in charge, and that the Commission had granted a hearing from the Committee, the result of which would be reported at the next meeting of the Board.

On motion of Commissioner Shields duly seconded by Commissioner Kell, they following resolution, after discussion, was unanimously adopted:

Be it Resolved, That this Board availing itself of the authority vested in it by Act No. 141 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana for the year 1916, entitled "An Act to authorize the Board of Commissioners for the Fifth Louisiana Levee District to issue and negotiate bonds not to exceed One Million Dollars additional to the issue authorized by Section 12 of Act 44 of 1886, and Act 134 of the General Assembly of Louisiana, Session of 1912, do issue its bonds to the amount of \$250,000 of the denomination of (\$1,000.00). One Thousand Dollars each; said bonds to be payable to bearer, to be signed by the President of this Board officially, and attested by the signature of the Secretary of the Board, to become due in fifty years, and to be payable at the option of the Board in forty years from the date of their issue; to bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum from the date of their issue; said interest to be evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds; payable semi-annually, payable at the office of the State Treasurer of Louisiana, Baton Rouge, La., and subject to all the terms, provisions and conditions of said Act 141 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana for 1916, and for purposes set forth herein.

Be it further Resolved, That this resolution and each and every part and clause thereof and every part and clause of Act 141 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana of 1916, be and they are hereby constituted a part of the contract between this Board and any and all future holders of any and all future coupons, to be issued under the provisions of this resolution and said Act 141, of 1916.

Be it further Resolved, That the President of this Board is hereby authorized and instructed to have (250) two hundred and fifty bonds of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, properly engraved as soon as possible, and to have them bear the date of January 15, 1922, and numbered from 1927 to 1777 inclusive.

Be it further Resolved, That the President of this Board and the members are hereby constituted a committee and are instructed to advertise for bids through the columns of several periodicals setting forth the date of sale and manner of sale, for the legal length of time. Said bids to be

sealed and shall be opened by the Board of Commissioners, at the domicile of the Board at Tallulah, La., at the specified time of the advertisement. Said bonds to be sold for not less than their par value and shall be in the following form, to-wit:

The Board of Commissioners for the Fifth Louisiana Levee District. Know all men by these presents, that the Board of Commissioners of the Fifth Louisiana Levee District, a corporation created by Act No. 44, of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana for the year 1886, approved July 2, 1886, for value received, promises to pay to bearer fifty years after date (with the option of said Board of Commissioners to pay the same after forty years from the date hereof) the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) together with interest thereon from the date hereof until such principal sum is paid at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the Fifteenth day of January and July in each year, on presentation and surrender of the respective interest coupons therefor attached as they severally become due.

Both the principal and interest of this bond are payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the Office of the Treasurer of the State of Louisiana at the Fiscal Agency of the State in the city of New Orleans.

This bond is one of a total authorized issue limited to \$1,000,000.00, authorized by the provisions of Act No. 141 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana for the year 1916, approved July 5th, 1916, under which bonds to the total amount of \$250,000.00 (not including this bond) have been issued to this date, and is issued pursuant to the provisions of said Act and pursuant to the resolutions and proceedings of the Fifth Louisiana Levee District, duly taken for that purpose.

In witness whereof, this bond has been signed by the President and attested by the Secretary of said Board of Commissioners for the Fifth Louisiana Levee District and the seal of the said Board has been hereto affixed and each of the coupons hereto attached has been signed with the engraved or lithographed fac-simile signatures of said President and Secretary and this bond has been dated January 15, 1922.

On the 15th day of January, 1922, the Board of Commissioners for the Fifth Louisiana Levee District will pay to bearer thereof at the office of the Treasurer of the State of Louisiana or the Fiscal Agency of the State of Louisiana, \$25.00 in gold coin of the United States of America, being six months interest then due on bond No. _____ (Enclosure on Reverses.)

This bond, principal and interest, secured by taxes and by sale of public lands as provided by Act No. 141, of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, for the year 1916.

Resolved Further, That the President and Secretary of this Board be and they are authorized and directed to cause all such steps to be taken as may be necessary, convenient, or proper for the engraving or lithographing of said \$250,000.00 of bonds, their delivery to the Treasurer of the State of Louisiana, their registry at the office of the State Auditor, their withdrawal from the State Treasury and their delivery to the purchasers in accordance with Act No. 141 of 1916.

Resolved Further, That the proceeds of said bonds be used for levee purposes in this district, in accordance with the resolution heretofore adopted by this Board.

I hereby certify the above and foregoing to be a true, correct and complete copy of an extract from the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Commissioners for the Fifth Louisiana Levee District regularly held according to law and pursuant to due notice at the office of the Board and its domicile at Tallulah, Louisiana, on the 12th day of December, 1921, at which a quorum was present, containing all of the proceedings of said Board at said meeting relating to the issuance of bonds under the provisions of Act 141 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana of 1916.
