### PUT THE STREET LIGHTS ON.

If we are not out of order, we suggest to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that the street lights be turned on every morning for about an hour before daylight, for the convenience of a great many of our people and strangers who get up to take the 5:40 train out of this city. The town is in utter darkness this time of the morning, and we do not believe that it would add much expense to have the lights put on in this manner.

Strangers and our home-folks, a great many of whom either travel on this train or work on or around it on the railroad yards, would appreciate this service, and it would otherwise add to the pleasure of living in our progressive little city.

While we have made comment on this subject before, it was perhaps at a time when it was lighter in the mornings, and no definite step was taken to establish this service; but it seems to us that now that it is very dark at five-thirty in the morning, the lights could very profitably be put on from five to five-forty-five or six o'clock. It would only have to be kept up for a few weeks, before it would become unnecessary.

### THE MANSFIELD LUMBER AND MANUFACTURING CO. MAY LOCATE HERE.

Would Erect Large Saw Mill, Wood-Working Plant In Vidalia. Town Gives Option.

Vidalia will soon have an up-to-date saw mill and manufacturing plant, if the plans now under consideration by the Company materialize.

Gentlemen representing the Company appeared before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen in special session yesterday, and stated that they were desirous of obtaining a ninety days option on the property belonging to the town, located below the Missouri Pacific tracks in the town limits, with the privilege of leasing same, in the event their concern decides to build here. The Town granted the option, and stated that they would lease said land for the consideration of \$100.00 per annum, the company paying all taxes levied on the property.

We trust the concern will find our city thoroughly satisfactory for their plant, as the location here of such an industry, with its payroll, would do much to stimulate business.
