THE COTTON CROP.

A More Cheerful Outlook and the Average for October, as Compared with Previous Years.

New Orleans, Oct. 6--Although the month of September has not been altogether favorable to the crops, and there has been loss from shedding, rust and rot, and in sections from the caterpillars, the good foundation on which the crop rested at the close of August, has stood in the way of adverse circumstances, and though the loss from the possible prospects of six weeks back has been great, yet the yield promises to be much larger than last season.

The month closes upon much uncertainty, and in some sections our correspondents refer to the yield as dependent upon favorable picking weather and such as would develop and save whatever of the top crop is promised. In July the fruiting was excellent nearly all over the belt; the August fruiting was largely lost by shedding, and the top crop is by no means assured anywhere, though it may come out better than now supposed.


