The vote in the city of Waco was larger than at any previous election except the prohibition election of 1887.

Reports from Falls county compared with the vote in McLennan shows that Dickinson is elected district judge by a handsome majority.

The colored troops fought bravely for Jones in the Fourth ward. There were about 250 negro votes cast in the Third ward. Sixteen voters scratched on the congressional race.

Mayor Hinchman presided in the police court and fined Louis Adams \$5 for using loud and vociferous language, Bob Munlen, drumming for passengers on railroad platform, Ed Overbeck fighting \$5, John Blum selling beer on Sunday \$20.

The count in the Fourth ward of Waco was not complete until 10 o'clock last night averaging in their counting only 14 votes an hour. The First ward finished its count at 9 o'clock on the night of the 6th averaging in their counting 28 votes an hour.

A few jubilant republicans invested in some gunpowder last night and shot a few anvils on the square. The democrats gathered there also and cheered for Cleveland. Mr. D. H. Hardy addressed them and the cheering of the democrats drowned out the republican anvils.
