The city council at its first meeting in January of next year will fix the salaries of the city officers for the new terms which begin after the election next April. Pending this action candidates are laying low, like Mark Twain's coon waiting to "see what'll come outen it." Look out for announcements after the salaries are fixed.

A young fellow about 16 years old, was arraigned before Mayor Hinchman this morning on a charge of vag-

A Double Tragedy.

St. Louis, Mo., Nov. 29.—The details of a horrible outrage, murder and suicide came from Nevada, Missouri, to-day. The outrage and murder was committed eight miles south of Nevada, the victim being Miss Ella Wray, aged 21, the daughter of a widow lady and belonging to one of the best families in that section. Yesterday Miss Wray accompanied George Corb, who taught the district school and boarded with Mrs. Wray, to the city. Corb returned last night alone and informed a brother of Miss Wray that the girl had been dragged from the buggy and murdered by two unknown men. The body was found in a clump of bushes near the roadside, the young woman's throat being cut from ear to ear. Corb was placed under guard, and during the night committed suicide by taking poison, thus escaping lynching. The coroner's inquest developed the fact that the girl had been outraged and then murdered.

IT WASN'T MURDER.

A special from Nevada says the return of the deputy sheriff who was sent to the scene of the double tragedy throws new light on the affair and shows that instead of a murder and suicide it was a double suicide. Corb, who was 24 years old, was in love with the girl, who was but 19, and on Saturday the couple drove from the girl's home, eight miles from Nevada. They started home in a buggy, and Corb reached the home of the girl long after the inmates had retired. He went to bed in the house, but arose at 9:30 o'clock and complained of feeling very sick. He started to the well for a drink of water and as he was reaching over lost his balance and fell into the well a corpse. It was then discovered that the girl was missing, and a search soon revealed her body lying by the roadside about half a mile from the house. Her body showed no signs of violence and her clothing gave no evidence of a struggle, and to all appearances she had died from the effects of the same poison that had killed her lover. It is supposed the poison was purchased in Nevada, and the couple took it simultaneously on the road home.

Tascott Possibly Captured.

Louisville, Ky., Nov. 29.—The Courier-Journal's Mount Sterling, Ky. special says: A man supposed to be Tascott, the murderer of millionaire Snell of Chicago, was captured last night in Meniere by a posse of men, under the leadership of Deputy Marshal John Day. This man for some weeks past has been staying about Owingsville, Bath county. He gave his name as Dickerson. A few days ago he borrowed a fine shotgun at Owingsville, and stated that he was going to the mountains to prospect for minerals. From a description and photograph of Tascott, suspicion attached to Dickerson, as he answered the description most minutely. He was followed to the mountains, and after a fight, in which he was wounded he was captured and lodged in the Frenchburg jail. He had in his possession a large sum of money, and refused to say where he got it.

Cattle Dying of Poverty.

Panhandle, Tex. Nov. 28.—More than the usual number of cattle at this time of year are dying of poverty. The native Texas cattle are all in good shape for the winter, but quite a number of Colorado and New Mexico cattle have been shipped to this point, and driven down on Salt Fork and into the White Deer pasture, in the northern part of this country. These cattle are said to be doing very rapidly.
