HEALTH MATTERS.

MEETING OF THE BOARD AND WHAT IT DID YESTERDAY AFTERNOON.

Steps to Prevent the Spread of Cholera—Fare Water Examined in Health—Fountains for the Poor Recommended.

A special meeting of the Board of Health was held in the Mayor's office yesterday afternoon, at which were present—Mayor French, Doctors F. Herff, Tyner and Braunengel, and R. Bennett, Secretary.

Dr. F. Herff stated that the object of this meeting was to consider the possibility of the spread of the cholera plague from Europe to this country, and to deliberate upon the best method of making provision to prevent it possible its advent into San Antonio, and should it come, to make provision to keep it under control as far as possible.

He also thought that the hydrant water should come direct from the head springs of the river, and not pass into the reservoir and there remain subject to contamination.

Mayor French here stated that the Water Company was making preparations to procure water from a fresh, pure spring free from the contaminating effects of the Olmos, and that the council and Board of Health had been invited to view the new location.

On the motion of Dr. Tyner, concluded to investigate this method of procuring pure water, and if it is practicable to request that the change be made immediately.

Dr. Herff recommended the establishment of drinking fountains at various places in the city, in order that the poor might have fresh and pure water in abundance.

Dr. Braunengel alluded to that portion of Pecos street and its vicinity where there were no water mains and the citizens were solely dependent for water supply upon the polluted ditches.

Dr. Herff then moved the appointment of a committee to draft proper regulations and suggestions to be published for the information of citizens in case of the advent of cholera, which was carried.

Doctors Braunengel, Tyner and Herff composed this committee, which is requested to report at the next regular meeting of the board.

Mayor French spoke of the present sanitary condition of the city and read reports of sanitary officers to show what work they had done under the present Board, and that no vault shall be constructed without an application for permit from the Board of Health; that the needless excavator only be used in a sanitary manner in this city.

DEMOCRATS

IN NATIONAL CONVENTION NOW IN SESSION AT CHICAGO.

Committee on Platform—An Even Thing on the Tariff Question—Butler's Chances—The Texas Delegation, Etc., Etc.

CHICAGO, July 9.—The Committee on Permanent Organization met this evening and decided to recommend to the convention the name of W. F. Vilas, of Wisconsin, for Permanent Chairman, and that the remaining officers of the temporary organization be made permanent.

The Texas headquarters at the Grand Pacific were largely visited to-night. Governor Hubbard, Temporary Chairman, stood at the end of the room, hundreds of delegates and visitors, including many ladies, passing through, being presented to him. Toward 6 o'clock the rooms were so crowded that attendance was refused.

Daniel Manning and Delegate Fellows, of New York, addressing the delegates in behalf of Cleveland, making strong appeals for their candidate.

Senator Laurier made a short speech, dwelling upon the interest of the South.

No formal poll of the Texas delegation has been made, but careful inquiry to-night indicates that Bayard has 18 votes and Cleveland 21, while four of the delegates admit that they are undecided.

It is not believed that Texas will vote as a unit for the reason that the recent State convention at Fort Worth abolished the two-thirds rule in State and county matters, hence the delegation does not feel warranted in exercising a majority rule to invoke a solid vote in the convention.

This afternoon Hubbard's visit in his delegation was recorded in favor of sustaining the unit rule. After Bayard, Texas is almost unanimous for Thurman.

The trade and labor organizations of the city indulged in another parade this evening and again attempted to get a speech from Ben Butler. The working men formed in procession on Market street, and accompanied by a number of bands and banners, marched through all the principal streets, and finally brought up in front of the Palmer Hotel, where Butler is stopping. Here occurred a repetition of the scene of Saturday night. The crowds on the streets became so dense and the cheers and yells so loud that Butler could not be heard, and his waving his Panama hat, it would have been impossible for him to comply with the demand for a speech, and finally disposed. He remained at the window half an hour bowing his acknowledgments and then retired.
