SEND TO RED CROSS

ROOSEVELT RECOMMENDS RELIEF BE IN THEIR CHARGE.

All Supplies and Provisions Should Be Consigned to Red Cross, San Francisco—Would Be Better to Send All Monies to Mr. Schiff, National Treasurer, in New York City.

The following statement has been issued from the White House:

"To the public: After a full consultation with Secretary Taft, the president of the American National Red Cross association, who also, as secretary of war, is controlling the army work and the expenditure of the money, probably \$2,500,000, appropriated and to be appropriated by congress for the relief of San Francisco, I wish to make the following suggestion:

"Contributions, both in money and in kind, are being given most generously for the relief of those who have suffered through this appalling calamity. Unless there is a proper organization for the handling of these contributions, they will in large part be wasted and in large part fail to reach the stricken people whom it is most to be desired they should reach.

"The American National Red Cross association has sent out to take charge of the relief work, Dr. Edward Devine, general secretary of the Charity Organization society of New York, whose experience has been very large in work of this kind. Dr. Devine will work in conjunction with Judge Morrow, United States circuit judge of the Ninth circuit, and the head of the California Red Cross association.

"General Funston has already been directed to cooperate with Dr. Devine, and has advised the secretary of war that he will do so. Secretary Metcalf, who is on his way to the Pacific slope, will at once put himself in touch with Dr. Devine, as well as with the judge, the governor of California

and the mayor of San Francisco, to see if there is anything else the administration can do, and he will assist in all possible ways the effort to systematize what is being done.

"I recommend that all charitable and relief organizations and individuals who desire to contribute do so through the Red Cross association and that where provisions and supplies be sent they be consigned to Dr. Devine, Red Cross, San Francisco, and that Dr. Devine be notified by telegraph of such consignments.

"At the same time, Jacob H. Schiff, treasurer of the New York Red Cross association in New York, may be notified that the consignments have been sent to Dr. Devine, or else the notification can be sent to Charles H. Keep, assistant secretary of the treasury, Washington, D. C., and assistant treasurer of the Red Cross organization.

"I suggest that all contributions that have already been forwarded be brought to the attention of Dr. Devine by telegraph, which telegram should state the name and address of the consignee and the amount and nature of the consignment. It is better to send all moneys to Mr. Keep or Mr. Schiff; they will then be telegraphed to Dr. Devine as the money is needed."

FRISCO TITLES REPORTED SAFE.


The Hall of Records is Said to Have Escaped Flames.

TALLEST SKYSCRAPER IN THE WHOLE WORLD.



Engineers, architects, and builders everywhere are interested in the plans made public from New York for a skyscraper that will out skyscraper anything yet built. These plans were filed with the New York building department by Ernest Flagg, for the proposed Singer building. Nothing more radical has ever been attempted on either side of the ocean than is embodied in the plans for this structure. The building is to be forty stories high and other buildings in New York and Chicago which now cause people to become stiff-necked looking up at them will, by comparison, appear small.

Two of the tallest Chicago buildings, the Masonic Temple and the Majestic Theater, would be but one story higher than the Singer building. If one were placed on top of the other. There will be 595 feet of the structure above ground and probably 125 feet of it below the street surface, so that, all told, it will be ten feet longer than the mammoth Amerika, the biggest steamship afloat.

It was supposed the limit had been reached in this style of structure, but it seems not. Before long a fifty story pile may be expected to make slow going people gasp.

While Chicago was the pioneer in the erection of tall buildings, it has in the last few years been far outstripped by New York. The constantly increasing population of Manhattan Island and the impossibility of increasing the ground area for the accommodation of the people made it necessary to run the buildings higher and higher until it is impossible to tell when the limit will be reached.
