Interest Young Farmers in Rais-
ing Exhibits for Next
Grape Carnival

Enthusiastic effort on the part of a number of the members of the Commercial Club, Supt. M. S. Lewis and others interested in the welfare of the schools and community have not been unproductive of practical results, for a movement is now launched which will be a decisive factor in shaping the future success of the valley. The recent decision of the school board to install a department of agriculture in the public schools is one which will be far-reaching in its influence, for the young men and women who are reared in this community of rural and suburban farm homes have need of the knowledge embraced in a four-years' agricultural course under the personal direction of an expert along these lines. It is vital knowledge, this study of the soil and its productions, and should be a fascinating study even for those who expect to spend their lives in some other profession than tilling the rich lands of the Columbia River Fruit Belt.

The board has been in correspondence with Wm. Meikle, now engaged in institute work in Montana and formerly of the Washington State College and it is probable that his services will be engaged at the beginning of the next school year. The most up-to-date methods of instruction, which combine scientific theory with practical working knowledge of the principles of agriculture and horticulture, will be used in carrying on the new department.

Another outgrowth of the local interest in re-directed education is the agricultural contest which has been instituted in the Kennewick schools and which is open to the sixth, seventh and eighth grades this summer and which is governed by the following regulations:

"Each contestant must perform his own work, which includes the preparation of the soil for planting, cultivation, irrigation and harvesting the crop.

"The area of the ground upon which products for the exhibit may be grown is not to exceed 800 square feet.

"Any vegetable or flower which can be produced in one season may be exhibited.

"The prizes are to be awarded at the time of the Grape Carnival by judges appointed by the management of the Grape Carnival."

The main purpose of the institution of this contest is to stimulate the interest of the children in home gardening by competition for prizes. This is already being realized, for the excitement among the children of the grades admitted has been great since the plan was explained to them a few days ago and sixty five young agriculturalists are already enlisted in the race. Many have already begun work on their garden plots.

Those who have contributed to the prize fund are: L. L. Rand, of Spokane, architect of the high school building offers a prize of \$5.00 for the best 10 square feet of astors and \$5.00 for the best 10 square feet of tomatoes.
