Minnesota Does Not Want a Negro Colony

The settlers of Beltrami county, in the vicinity of Black Duck, are aroused over the news that Booker T. Washington, leader of the colored race in America, has an agent getting options on lands in Black Duck township, with a view of purchasing land on which to establish a colony of negroes. The settlers declare that the colony shall not come to pass if they can stop it. They say they will make it hot for the colonists if they undertake to come in numbers to Beltrami county.

The agent of Washington is said to have obtained options on several thousand acres. The county is new land, good, and it is said that Washington figures on very gratifying results from the sending of southern negroes to northern homes. His plan is to cut the land into farms of 40 or 50 acres to each family. The agent who has obtained the options says that plenty of money is forthcoming to close the deal. He has contracted to pay pretty good prices in some cases.


