## COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS.

Wenatchee, Wash., Nov. 17, 1908.  
Commissioners convened at 9 a. m., all members present.

Minutes approved as read.  
In the matter of the amount of bond of incoming treasurer same is placed at \$75,000.00.

In the matter of the Markle mining claims Wampacco, Golden Gate, Black Bear, Crescent Mines, Buzzard Mines, Tye Mines, Summit & Mount View Mines & W. R. Rust's, Gold Crown Red Chief Mines, the treasurer is ordered to correct tax rolls down to date of issuing patents for same.

In the matter of the state aid money for 1909 and a like amount appropriated for said purpose.

Whereas, At a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Chelan County, State of Washington, held in the commissioners' office of said county on the 18th day of November, 1908, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That public interest demands the improvement, under the provisions of Chapter 150 of the laws of 1907, of that section of a public highway situate within the County of Chelan and described as follows:

Commencing at the north end of the Horan Bridge near the center of Sec. 28, T. 23 N., R. 20 across the Wenatchee River; thence along road No. 27, sometimes called the Wenatchee River road, a distance of two and one-half (2½) miles or more to the easterly end of road No. 142 or the H. D. Hall road in ne¼ of ne¼ Sec. 19, T. 23 N., R. 20 E. W. M., being a distance of about 2¼ miles, no part of said highway being situated within the boundaries of any city or incorporated town.

In the matter of petitions for voting precincts of W. M. Caswell, W. J. Coventry and S. P. Beecher referred back to petitioners to be adjusted later.

In the matter of L. L. Miller road same is laid over until it can be shown that the land is properly owned and waived and that title to waiver can be cleared up.

In the matter of the erroneous assessment of 5 mills for Union High school No. 3, as assessed against School District No. 23, it is ordered that same be stricken from the rolls for 1908.

In the matter of bridge plans it is ordered that a duplicate set of the plans of the Methow River bridge on state road No. 10 be procured of Bowerman & McCloy of Seattle, same to be Standard plans for a single span 250 foot bridge.

In the matter of the Peshastin bridge as follows:

Wenatchee, Wash., Nov. 18, 1908.  
To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Chelan County:

Gents: On the 14th day of November, 1908, I had occasion to visit what is known as the Peshastin bridge across the Wenatchee River situated in Sec. 20, T. 24 N., R. 18 E., and I find the same to be absolutely unsafe and dangerous to life and limb and hereby condemn the same as unsafe, and will say further that temporary repair may make it available for use for a few months only. And owing to the immense traffic using this bridge, no time should be lost in making temporary repairs until a new structure can take the place of this one.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that county advertise for bids for bridge across Wenatchee River at Peshastin as per plans and specifications on file in office of County Engineer, said bids to be opened on December 28, 1908, at 10 a. m.

It is hereby ordered that \$250.00 of the A. Y. P. Exposition fund be set aside for a school exhibit to be expended under direction of County School Superintendent.

In the matter of C. H. Burbank's plat of Cosy Cove Orchards same is hereby accepted and approved.

In the matter of vacation of part of road No. 146 between sta. 10 to 12 same having been platted in Cosy Cove Orchards is hereby accepted and granted.

In the matter of Herd District as petitioned for by W. S. Tallman et al. same is referred back to petitioners for more definite boundary, clerk to advise them.

In the matter of petition for the opening of the Hoffman road a survey of same according to field notes indicates that said road as surveyed did run in a tortuous manner through the land and lumber yard of the Lamb-Davis Lumber Co., to the great detriment of their holdings, and that said company did thereupon petition the

county board that said Hoffman road be changed to run around said company's lumber yard after a personal investigation by Commissioner Otis, who indicated a route between the original road and the route desired by the lumber company on as good ground and not appreciably longer as being fair to all parties concerned, said route having been petitioned for and surveyed by County Engineer and paid for by L. O. Lee it hereby ordered that the prayer of the petitioners for the proposed vacation and change be and is hereby granted.

In the matter of the Herd District as petitioned for by residents of said district it is ordered that same be established as per order on file.

In the matter of printing commissioners' proceedings it is ordered that all matters such as franchises and other matter not of vital interest to the public be eliminated from said printing at the discretion of Auditor.

In the matter of petition of City of Wenatchee for their portion of road and bridge fund for the year 1908 same is ordered expended as required by session laws of 1907, Page 129, Chapter 76 of said laws.
