

### SEVEN ACRES BRINGS WENATCHEE MAN \$5,000

Thomas Sisler of Wenatche Sold Crop for Cash on Delivery of Cars— Urges Several Reforms

Five thousand dollars for 5000 boxes of apples from seven acres of orchard, 2000 boxes of this yield being Ben Davis, the other 3000 boxes comprising Spitz, Rome Beauty, Jonathan and Winesap—this is what Thomas Sisler of Wenatche got for his 1913 apple crop. He sold for cash and was paid on delivery at the cars last fall. He was one of those who sold his orchard run to a cash buyer. Some of the reforms he urges in the fruit association work are:

The election of a new board of directors, all ranchers and having no other business except fruit raising.

The pay of the directors to be reduced from \$5 to \$3 per day.

A dividend of at least 6 per cent allowed stockholders yearly.

Allow each grower to designate through what agency he wants his fruit sold, whether on the Clark plan, the Distributors or any other agency.

Establish the unit voting system and allow only shippers in the association to vote for directors.

Have no stated price as commission for selling the fruit, as it may cost more under one system than under another.

### FOUR TONS OF SUGAR IS SHIPPED BY PARCEL POST

Okanogan Merchants Finds new System Cheaper Than by Freight—Can Save 71 Cents on 100 Pounds

A merchant at Conconully, the county seat of Okanogan county, has discovered that it is cheaper to ship sugar by parcel post than by freight. Accordingly, he has ordered four tons shipped from Seattle. The new rate on 50-pound parcels, which went into effect last Thursday will have a revolutionary effect in many sections.

The freight rate on 100 pounds from Seattle to Conconully follows: Seattle to Wenatchee, 39 cents; Wenatchee to Brewster, 50 cents; Brewster to Okanogan, 50 cents; Okanogan to Conconully, 40 cents, making a total for freight of \$1.79. This freight rate applies to such articles as sugar, rice and practically all foodstuffs.

By parcel post 100 pounds can be sent between these points for \$1.08. This means that instead of coming by freight the sugar will come in 50-pound lots by mail from Seattle to Wenatchee. This four-ton lot of sugar will be delivered by mail to the wharf boats. Again it goes by the mail on the C. & O. company's boat to Brewster. From Brewster it will be transferred to the Brawster postoffice; thence to the postoffice at Okanogan; then it will be toted by mail from Okanogan to the postoffice at Conconully.

A prediction has been made that this will practically put the mail contractors out of business. Instead of having light rigs for transporting mail it will be necessary to put on heavy freight wagons.

### Governor Appoints Five U. W. Regents

Governor Lister has appointed five new regents for the University of Washington to fill the places of the members of the board whom he forced to hand in their resignations two weeks ago. The new regents are Col. W. T. Perkins, of Seattle, a banker and business man; Dr. W. A. Shannon, a prominent physician of Seattle; Charles E. Gaches, a hay and grain dealer of Mt. Vernon; Winlock W. Miller, Seattle, a financial agent, and O. A. Fechter, of North Yakima. Of these men only Mr. Gaches is an alumnus of the University of Washington. The others received their education in eastern and Middle Western colleges. The regents who have resigned are J. C. Higgins, A. F. McEwan and Geo. H. Walker, of Seattle; A. L. Rogers, of Waterville, and A. F. Hazeltine, of South Bend. Mr. Walker was not asked to resign, but did so voluntarily, declaring that the action of the board in ousting Dr. Kane was right and he would stand by it. Mr. Higgins also issued a statement severely criticizing the governor for his interference with the action of the board. In answering the governor's objection to the time of asking Dr. Kane to resign the regents

call attention to the fact that, due to the ethics of the men who are university executives, and who will not consider the acceptance of a position until such a one is formally announced vacant, it was necessary to take action in order that a new head for the University might be chosen before the new college year begins next fall.
