PANAMA PACIFIC EXPOS'N WILL OPEN FEBRUARY 20th

The Upper Wenatchee Valley Should Be Represented—Have We Anything to Exhibit

The following letter, calling attention to the opportunity the people of the upper Wenatchee valley have to do some telling work for this section, practically without cost, should receive attention at the hands of our fruit growers. We have also valuable mineral, mica, marble, asbestos and talc that would attract attention at Frisco. All these natural resources should be on exhibition.

To The Leavenworth Echo: We are particularly anxious that the north central Washington country be well represented in the matter of the physical exhibits at the Panama Pacific International Exposition in San Francisco, commencing February 20th next, and continuing until December 1, 1915. It is estimated that twelve million people will visit this exposition from all parts of the world, and the opportunity will be unsurpassed for interesting prospective settlers of the right kind to locate in your section.

The Washington State Exposition Commission, with headquarters in Seattle, have worked out a plan whereby your community can get some valuable publicity at very little expense. They agree to take all exhibit material provided by the various communities, install it at San Francisco in the name of the grower and maintain it throughout the entire period of the exposition at their expense. The only expense your community will be put to is in providing the exhibits. That should not be difficult or expensive. Everyone should rally and cooperate with your commercial club in bringing out a fine supply of your best products. If every fruit grower or farmer would bring in something the sum total will be sufficiently large and good. Immediate action is necessary, as the harvest season is on, and if it is allowed to pass without securing exhibit material, this great opportunity will be forever lost, it will be impossible to show any of next year's crops.

All exhibit material should be carefully packed and addressed to the Washington State Exposition Commission, Seattle Wash.

Transportation charges from Seattle to San Francisco will be born by the State Commission.

Apple Crop Estimate of 1914

The following is an estimate submitted by Mr. A. P. Bateham, vice president of the Northwestern Fruit Exchange, Portland, Oregon, on the number of cars of apples to be shipped this season. The wide variation in reports from the districts has been taken into consideration and the whole compiled as nearly correct as is possible. By the collection of reports from each district the general belief is that the tonnage will be enormous, far exceeding former years, but Mr. Bateham's opinion of this is that the estimate points skyward, out of all proportion.

The indications as received are for a good grade this year in almost every variety. When there is an exception, it appears as though the variety had been left out of the scheme of things entirely this year. Yakima, as usual, will lead the shipping from the Northwest, with Wenatchee districts a close second, and Hood River an increasing third. The estimate as given, of course, are subject to the usual shrinkage, owing to storms, etc.

Mr. Bateham hopes to be able to give a much closer estimate by this time next month, and one which will indicate the marketing policies for the coming season. "Plans are in full swing," said Mr. Bateham, "to go ahead with our distribution as tho we could exactly tell just how many cars of apples we are going to market. While conditions may alter these plans as the season advances, we feel pretty certain of accomplishing our ultimate aim in this respect. The export markets will be dealt their percentage of the shipments of the apples going through the Northwestern Fruit Exchange on an established, systematic basis.

"The apparent total apple crop of the Northwest is 15,000 carloads, distributed throughout the various districts as follows:

WILL TRY TO AVOID CAR SHORTAGE

Investigations by the department of agriculture indicate that shippers and carriers are co-operating more closely this year to avert a car shortage in the movement of the country's 820,000,000 bushels estimated wheat yield.

While it would take 524 cars to move the entire estimated production, about 58 per cent of the crop usually is shipped out of the country where it is grown. On that basis it would require approximately 303,920 cars to carry this season's shipments.

It is the consensus of opinion that the increase in car supply does not keep pace from year to year with increasing need for cars.
