THE LAW GOVERNING POOL ROOMS AND CONCERT HALLS

The following digest of the laws governing the conducting of pool rooms, concert halls, etc., have been furnished us by the W. C. T. U. of Leavenworth with the request that they be published:

Sec. 2445. Keepers of Concert Halls, Saloons, etc. (Laws 1911, p. 649, Sec. 1)

Every person who—
(2) Shall admit to, or to remain in, any dance house, public pool or billiard hall, or in any place of entertainment injurious to health or morals, owned, kept, or managed by him, any person under the age of twenty-one years; or,

(3) Shall suffer or permit any such person to play any game of skill or chance, in any such place, or in any place adjacent thereto, or to be or remain therein * * * or,

(4) Shall sell or give, or permit to be sold, or given to any person under the age of twenty-one years any intoxicating liquor, cigar, cigarette, cigarette paper or wrapper, or tobacco in any form; or,

(5) Shall sell, or give, or permit to be sold or given to any person under the age of eighteen years, any revolver, pistol or toy pistol;

Shall be guilty of a gross misdemeanor. It shall be no defence to a prosecution for a violation of this section that the person acted, or was believed by the defendant to act, as agent or representative of another.

Any person under the age of twenty-one years who shall purchase, or shall have in his or her possession, any intoxicating liquor, cigar, cigarette, cigarette paper or wrapper, or tobacco in any form, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

MISCELLANEOUS

Twenty new national banks were chartered by the comptroller of currency during the month of July and increase in capital stock was granted to fifty-four national banks.

On July 31, 1919, there were 7,289 national banks in operation with applications for 224 new charters awaiting the comptroller's approval, with a proposed capital of \$15,207,000.

Since January 1, 1919, there have been only two small national bank failures in the entire United States. This record for immunity from failure has not been equaled since 1870.

The United States owns one-seventh of the cattle in the world, one-tenth of the sheep and one-third of the swine. In cattle India stands first, the U. S. second, and Russia, Brazil and Argentina in order. In sheep Australia is first, the U. S. second, then come Argentina, Russia and New Zealand. When it comes to swine we are not only first but own

more hogs than our ten nearest competitors combined.

A new 24 cylinder liberty motor has just been tested by the war department. Its normal horse power is 673 as compared with 400 for the 12 cylinder, and its weight per horse power is slightly less than the 12 cylinder. An engine of this type run at normal speed would enable the use of a comparatively large slow speed propeller without gear reduction, thus increasing propeller efficiency.

A radical change in live stock reports will soon be inaugurated by the department of agriculture. Instead of an annual report showing totals by States of the cattle, swine, sheep, etc., in this country, the report will be made monthly and the totals will be by counties, there being over 3,000 agricultural counties. In addition stocks will be divided into thoroughbred, grade and scrubs; also breeders, dairy and feeders. Stocks of feed including ensilage, etc., will be shown.

DESERTS AUTOS FOR PLANES.

Ernest Schneider, one of the first automobile men in Yakima, has announced that he would retire permanently from the automobile business and devote all his time to airplane work. Schneider, owner of the Washington Auto Company, has sold four-fifths of his stock to Thomas Anderson and Thomas Kirk and will retire from active management. He says the deal was made on a basis of \$50,000 for the business. He now has one Curtiss plane and expected to buy another. He will open a school for training pilots.

labor to get what it can and come back for more later on. He said a spirit of unrest pervades all classes, but the atmosphere is clearing.

Suspension of all strikes throughout the United States and the declaration of a labor truce on the basis of the status quo for six months or more to enable President Wilson to bring about a reduction in the cost of living is recommended in the report of a committee of the New York state federation of labor made public this week.

A recent survey of the fire hazard situation in Wenatchee conducted by the Washington state board of underwriters has resulted in an offer to reduce the insurance rate on all concrete, brick or stone buildings in the city. A proviso is made that one additional member be added to the fire department. In some cases the reduction in rates will amount to as much as 25 per cent.
