

BEEKEEPERS WILL FIGHT ISLE OF WIGHT DISEASE.

Far-reaching measures to protect the beekeeping industry of North America against the introduction from Europe of the so-called Isle of Wight disease, which has done great damage in parts of Europe, were advocated at a meeting of American and Canadian officials held recently at the Bureau of Entomology of the United States Department of Agriculture. Thus far the disease has not made its way to either the United States or Canada.

A ban against the introduction of queen bees from any foreign country except Canada was advocated. The meeting further decided to use all feasible efforts to prevent the introduction of adult bees into the United States except for experimental and scientific purposes by the United States Department of Agriculture. It is expected that Canada will establish the same safeguards to the beekeeping industry, and for this reason it is not planned to limit shipment of bees from or to Canada. The disease, which first appeared in 1904 in the Isle of Wight, has since swept to all parts of Great Britain, causing large losses.

Beekeepers who see any outbreak of any disease of adult bees are urged to send at once samples for examination and diagnosis to the Bureau of Entomology, Washington, D. C. Detailed information concerning the disease may be obtained by writing to the United States Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C., for a copy of Department Circular No. 218, entitled "The Occurrence of Diseases of Adult Bees," which is now available for free distribution.

DECADE SHOWS CHANGES IN TYPES OF ROAD MATERIALS.

In the last 10 years there has been a great change in the type of road suitable for traffic conditions on main traveled highways, according to engineers of the Bureau of Public Roads of the United States Department of Agriculture. In 1910 plain and surfaced treated macadam were considered among the highest types

of paving for country roads and a large percentage of the mileage was of the two types. There was a small mileage of brick and concrete and a somewhat larger mileage of bituminous macadam but the plain and surface treated macadam were the predominant types of hard surface roads. How great the change has been is shown by figures recently issued by the bureau. On Federal aid roads completed between 1916 and 1920 only 2.9 per cent of the total area paved was plain and surface treated macadam. The types that formerly constituted such a small part of the mileage were as follows: Bituminous macadam, 3.1 per cent; bituminous concrete, 6.3 per cent; cement concrete, 19.3 per cent; and brick 4.1 per cent.

HIGH PRICE FOR WATER.

Sixty cents a pound is the price some Seattle people have been paying for ordinary water.

Five samples of oysters bought in Seattle fish markets, and tested at the office of the state chemist at the University of Washington, were all found to have been watered artificially.

In each case the water content was nearly sixty per cent, or more than twenty per cent above normal.

A "watering test" developed by Charles W. Johnson, state chemist, was used in determining the results. The experiments were made in cooperation with the Seattle health department.
