


DRYDEN.

COST TO TAXPAYER OF STATE COLLEGE.

One cent and 9-100 of a cent—that is all it cost the Chelan county taxpayer out of his dollar to support the State College of Washington, including not alone the training of some 3,000 young men and women, but work of experiment stations which are adding to the production and economic up-keep of the state's agriculture, and in the state-wide extension service which reaches out to every corner of Washington, serving all those who have no children at college.

The taxpayer of this county whose year's taxes are \$100 divides it about as follows:

State Normal Schools.....	\$ .95
State College .....	1.09
University .....	1.81
Roads .....	20.20
Common Schools .....	39.15
Other State Expenses.....	7.28
Other County & City expense..	29.52
<b>Total.....</b>	<b>\$100.00</b>

What does that \$1.09 do at the State College of Washington? Last year 91c 6 mills of it educated the 2,700 students; 10c 4 mills was expended for the experiment stations, including the Western Washington station at Puyallup; and 7c was the portion of the state-wide extension service.

If your tax assessment runs up to \$200 for the year, only \$3.27 goes to the State College; if it is \$500, the State College gets but \$5.45. Thousands of Washington state tax-payers have gotten back many times that in gains on a single crop which the college has helped, through the experiment stations or extension service or advice of the professors, to handle more economically and successfully. And this sort of help is growing by leaps and bounds every year.
