Galena, Kan., Feb. 8.—Great excitement prevails over the appearance in this city of Tyler Gavitt, who disappeared in March last from the Windsor stock farm, owned by Solon L. Cheney, one of the most prominent citizens of the county at the time.

Neighbors took charge of Gavitt's crop and other property and disposed of it and circulated the report that Cheney had murdered him. This act led to an assault upon Perry Stevens, brother of the county attorney, by Cheney, for which a \$50,000 damage suit is now pending.

WINTER WORK IN MINES

BUSY COEUR D'ALENE CAMPS.

Big Rush to the Pierre's Lake District Following the Reported Strike in the Little Gem—Shipments From Kaslo and Rossland.

The deep snow has not interfered with the activity that prevails in all of the Coeur d'Alene camps. All of them are now livelier than they have ever been. At Mullan the Morning mill is pounding out more concentrates than ever before since it has been operated, and the owners, Larson & Greenough, are said to be clearing up a good profit on their shipments.

A rich strike has been made in the Little Gem in the Pierre's Lake district, but nothing definite could be gained. Some of the samples were brought to Marcus, which showed maleable free gold, and it was stated that they would assay all the way from \$25,000 to \$40,000 to the ton. These were not mere chips, but they were chunks of rock six inches long, which would weigh from five to ten pounds.

Kaslo Shipments. The Payson mine has repaired its machinery and rejoins the list of shippers for the past week, with a record of 450 tons of ore, which brings the total shipments for the week over the Kaslo & Slocan railway for water transportation from Kaslo to 1300 tons, as follows:

On Clugston Creek. A. T. Winter, secretary and treasurer of the Comstock Mining company, received returns from the Tacoma smelter for their first shipment of ore from their properties on Clugston creek, 10 miles north. The character of the ore is lead carbonates carrying silver. The returns show a net profit of \$23.30 per ton, or \$406 to the full carload. The Comstock is a promising silver-lead property on Clugston creek, and with its present development has a shipping capacity of about three carloads of ore per week with a force of six men. The ore shipped was taken from the main shaft at a depth of 130 feet from the surface from a well defined ledge four feet in thickness.

In the Port Steele District. The North Star mine in Port Steele district is increasing its working force, rich ore has been made on the Dibble group in Port Steele district, but the owners are reticent about giving information. The ore in the lowest levels is said to run over \$400 per ton in gold and silver. Charles F. Smith of Spokane has taken a bond from George E. Watson and Harold Winterbotham on the Burton, Winston and Maple Leaf claims on Elk river, paying \$600 cash, the balance of \$14,000, payable November 4, 1898.

Metal Production. The average production of all metals in Montana last year was \$3,352,291 per month. Colorado averaged \$2,914,735 and California averaged \$1,599,235. Southern Kootenay had exported up to January 29 a total of \$1,193,438. This puts the dis-

RETIREMENT OF SUTRO.

IS MENTALLY INCAPACITATED.

He Will Therefore Be Seen No More in Active Business Life—His Property Interests Are Vast—He Owns an Eighth of the Taxable Area of San Francisco County.

San Francisco, Feb. 9.—Ex-Mayor Adolph Sutro, made world famous through his construction of the Sutro tunnel of Nevada, has been declared mentally incapable of conducting his large business interests by the courts. This action was taken on application of his daughter, Mrs. Dr. E. Merritt. Mr. Sutro will therefore be seen no more in active business life.

The effect of his withdrawal from business may have on many enterprises with which he is connected is a matter to be determined by a family council and lawyers. His interests are so vast and diversified that the manner of their disposition is a matter of great moment. The greater part of his fortune is in real estate. In San Francisco alone he owns over 1800 acres of land—about an eighth of the taxable area of the county.

T. WELCH GOT TWENTY YEARS.

Helena, Mont., Feb. 8.—Thomas Welch, a half-breed Indian, who was convicted of murder in the second degree in Custer county, was taken to the state penitentiary yesterday, where he will serve a 20-year term. Welch was associated with George F. Geddes in the murder of Winnie Brown, a young Tongue river rancher. Brown was killed by a colored man named Dixon, who had been urged to make away with him by Geddes and Mrs. Geddes.

Three Miners Buried in the Cariboo Country. Vancouver, B. C., Feb. 8.—News has been received here of a landslide at Quesnelle Forks, Cariboo. Power House Destroyed.

Montreal, Feb. 7.—The transforming house of the Citizens' Power and Light Company at Cote St. Paul, a suburb of this city, was destroyed by fire last night. Loss, \$100,000. The company derived its power from the Lachine rapids, the electric current carried to Montreal through cables. The plant has been running but a few weeks.

A Millionaire's Mansion.

New York, Feb. 5.—Potter Palmer, the wealthy hotel man of Chicago, is about to build at Newport a mansion which, it is said, will be even more palatial and luxurious than any of the other beautiful summer homes there. Mr. Palmer, it is understood, expects to spend between \$2,000,000 and \$3,000,000 on his new home.

Big Fire in Missouri.

St. Joseph, Mo., Feb. 9.—Fire at 2 o'clock yesterday morning destroyed a block of business buildings at Savannah, Andrew county. The loss at this hour, can not be estimated accurately, but it will not exceed \$30,000.

BURNING OF TWO INDIANS.

Official Report of the Atrocious Crime in Oklahoma.

Washington, Feb. 8.—The attorney general sent to the senate yesterday a letter written by Assistant United States Attorney McMechan, giving the results of his investigation into the recent burning of two Seminole Indians in Oklahoma by a mob. He says that the sentiment in the neighborhood of the crime is all with the mob, and he was informed that it would not be well for him or any other person to go into that locality if it was known that the object was to locate the conspirators.

Mr. McMechan's letter tells in the main an old story, but he gives some new details. McGiesey was, he says, the first of the Indians to move a muscle after the torch was applied and he did not move until the flesh was beginning to drop from his limbs and was beginning to touch his ears.

Buccooed at Seattle.


