

Senator Brown has introduced in the legislature a bill authorizing the construction by the Pacific Cable Company of a cable between the United States and these islands. The Pacific Cable Company, better known as the Seymour Company, is the one whose bill in the American congress has just been reported favorably by the committee.

The Hawaiian bill gives exclusive cable rights to the islands for 20 years. The cable must be laid within 18 months after the passage of the act by the American congress, and be extended to Japan within three years. It must be capable of transmitting 15 words a minute. The toll rate between here and San Francisco is not to exceed 35 cents per word, and to Japan 90 cents per word. In case of war the president may seize the cable and exclude all messages he sees fit. A guarantee of \$25,000 in government bonds must

be put up by the company.

There seems but little doubt that the bill will speedily pass, and the long-expected cable will probably be laid late this summer. If the United States goes to war with Spain there is scarcely any doubt that the cable will be laid in very short order.
