BIG REPUBLICAN MAJORITY GIVEN IN ADAMS COUNTY

Returns Show Large Republican Gains Over Vote Polled in 1904--Spirited Election and Clean Politics Manifested Throughout the Day At the Polls.

Voters Acquit Themselves Well.

The election is now a thing of the past and its results must be most pleasing to the people of Adams county. Never before in her history has her inhabitants been called upon to decide a contest more spirited or more bitterly fought out, and all lovers of clean politics are to be congratulated upon the magnificent manner in which they acquitted themselves at the polls. The results of Tuesday's election will

prove to be far-reaching; never again will those influences which have in the past hung like a mill-stone round the neck of our local democracy attempt to dictate to the people and to the party to whom they are a disgrace, whom they shall nominate to public office. To those voters who so ably supported the Republican party in the campaign just closed the county owes a debt of gratitude immeasurable. Not

so much because they elected the candidates of that party but because they had the courage and manhood to overwhelmingly defeat those candidates of the opposing party whose election was deemed so undesirable. The great majority given Mr. Edwards, for example, must not be considered altogether as a mark of his personal popularity; it was due, in no small measure, because of the unpopularity of the

candidate for county office of his opponent. And this is true, in a way, all down the line. There is one creditable thing about the result: The defeated candidates realize that some one had to be defeated and, with very few exceptions, take their defeat like men. A detailed review of the entire vote cast in the county will be found in this issue, and it is worth your while examining.

HUGHES WINS OUT BY 52,000

But the Race in New York for Second Place is a Close One.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—Incomplete returns from two-thirds of the counties of the state of New York made it impossible up to 11 o'clock tonight to give definite figures on the state ticket other than for governor. Charles E. Hughes, republican candidate for governor, has a majority of 52,000 approximately, but the remainder of the candidates are in doubt. For lieutenant governor, Lewis Stuyvesant Chanler, democratic-Independent league candidate, has a lead in the city of Greater New York of 134,941. Up state M. Linn Bruce, republican candidate for lieutenant governor, is running slightly ahead of Mr. Hughes' vote. As Mr. Hughes came down to Greater New York with a lead of approximately 129,000, it will readily be seen that the vote for second place on the ticket will be very close, and only the complete official count will determine the successful candidate. At 11 o'clock 40 out of the 60 counties in the state had completed the count and turned in the figures. From these it was impossible to predict the result of the entire count as to the subordinate places on the two tickets. At republican state headquarters no definite statement or claim is to be had, but based on returns already in, it appears that Bruce is elected by 5000. It was stated that as there were still about 20 counties to be heard from officially, nothing would be given out until
