

Notice to the Voters and Taxpayers of Chehalis County.

Whereas, The board of county commissioners of Chehalis county, at their next session, 1890, ordered; that a proposition be submitted to the voters of Chehalis county, to bond the said Chehalis county for 5 per cent. of its assessment in 1890, as returned by the assessor and equalized by the board of equalization of said county, said bonds to be redeemed at the end of fifteen and twenty years from date of issue, and said bonds obtained by the sale of said bonds to be expended for the following purposes, to-wit:

1. To refund the present indebtedness of Chehalis county.

2. To build two bridges across the Chehalis river.

3. To build one main road from east end of Chehalis county to ocean beach at mouth of Chehalis creek.

4. To build four roads to North Fork, one each from Oakville, Elma, Pouche and Cosmopolis.

5. To repair and build road up the Chehalis river.

6. To repair and build road up the Mollum creek.

7. To repair and build road up the Cochee river.

8. To repair and build road up the Kah river.

9. To repair and build road up the Tulips river.

10. To repair and build road up the Rain river.

11. To repair and build road up the Spruce river.

12. To build road from Cosmopolis to Pouche.

13. To build one bridge across the Kah river.

14. To build two bridges across the Tulips river.

15. To build road from Quinault to Stevens prairie.
