

Coming to the Front.

It is wonderful what a start North Aberdeen is taking. Three manufacturing establishments have been located on that property, viz: Charles R. Bell, plant for manufacturing all kinds of fancy house finishing; Henry K. Prosser, plant for manufacturing ice with a capacity of five tons per day; Jones, Burrows, Hunt & Bell, box and shingle factory. Mr. A. Young, the owner of the property, donated the sites to the factories, which shows his good sense and shrewd business ability, and places his property of North Aberdeen in the front rank for desirable business and residence locations. Besides these industries, there are forty or fifty business and residence houses to be erected in North Aberdeen just as soon as the slashing is burned over so as not to endanger the buildings. The sign of the times indicate that the greatest growth of the city will be up the Wishkah river, in North Aberdeen.

Sash, Door and Box Factory.

Through the energy of the board of trade, a bonus of \$2,000 in cash was raised and paid to Messrs. Whitehouse, Crimmins & Cook for the location here of a first-class sash, door and box factory. These gentlemen put up a splendid building on Market street, near the Wishkah river, and have invested in this industry about \$20,000. They employ a large force of men, and turn out work of superior quality. The fact that they are kept constantly busy is an index of Aberdeen's prosperity, and of the mutual benefit of manufactures and municipal growth.

The New Armory.

The contract has been let for the building of the new armory, to be erected by Messrs. Johnston and Finch for the use of Company K. The building is a two-story structure, 50x105 feet in size, and the lower floor is to be devoted to the use of the militia boys. It will be fitted with gun racks and all the necessary paraphernalia needed and will be a source of pride to the company.

Work has been begun, and the building is to be completed within sixty days, and by February 1st the company will be at home in their new quarters.

The plans were designed by C. B. Douglas, and the building presents a neat appearance. It will be a creditable addition to the western portion of our city.

The Foundry.

The Aberdeen foundry and machine shops, of which Wm. Miner is proprietor, is one of the most important institutions in this city and has the largest capacity for doing business of any plant of that character in Southwestern Washington. A stroll through the works shows a large force of men busily engaged on all classes of machine work and castings. Mr. Miner has just completed a water-works plant of his own which consists of a large tank with supply pipes running to the river and a separate engine which furnishes the power. They have force enough to throw an inch and one-half stream seventy-five feet high, and with 150 feet of two inch and 150 feet of one and one-half inch hose are well prepared for fire.

A New Industry.

A Damitio has in operation on Wishka street, near his residence, a thirty-horse power boiler, lathe, scroll-saw, grip-saw, and all the machinery necessary for use in making mouldings, turnings, scroll-work and finishing lumber for general building. He finds an excellent field where there is plenty to do.

Well Built.

A substantial addition to Aberdeen, the Hood building is worthy of more than passing mention. The exterior is as attractive as the interior is convenient and commodious. A plate glass front adorns the entrance, and the front is still further improved by the fine ornamental work done in rodwood shingles, the shingling extending all the way around the side on F street.

The interior of the first floor is divided off with a room in the rear for paints and oils which is well lighted by a 16-candle power electric light. In the main store room an office 9x12 is partitioned off, carpeted well furnished and well lighted by electricity. The main store, which is 25x64, is fitted up on one side with shelves for hardware, all the upper shelves being brought conveniently to hand by a railroad step-ladder. A large upright showcase for tools is built in the center of the shelving. The opposite side of the room is somewhat similarly arranged for tinware. Three large 75-candle power electric lights furnish all the illumination desired for this portion of the building. The entire second story is used for stores and storage, and is also lighted by a 75-candle power light.

Following is the Application of the T. O. & G. H. Railroad.

Section 1. That the right-of-way is hereby granted to the Tacoma, Olympia & Grays Harbor railroad company to build, extend and operate its railroad on River, Front and First streets, and to be constructed on such grade as will conform to the grade of streets heretofore or may hereafter be adopted by the city. And provided that said railroad company shall provide and maintain all necessary crossings of said road where it crosses any street or alley, and shall not obstruct the travel thereby with their engines or cars to exceed ten minutes at any time.


