Mr. Burrows now has a gas works in operation in Walla Walla, and is fully conversant with the business... The iron pillars for the stone fronts of the J. Dabney block, on the corner of Heron and H streets, are being cast at the Douglas Brothers' foundry. This firm is now doing some very heavy work for the local mills instead of having it shipped from outside... County Auditor Campbell has received notice from state auditor of amount of state taxes which Chehalis county will be required to raise this year. The county's valuation was raised from \$7,880,142 to \$8,103,890. State taxes to be raised are: General—\$19,704; amount delinquent for 1896, \$2,211.83; school—\$30,400; for 1897, \$2,122.57; military—\$788; for 1897, \$142.84; interest—delinquent for 1897, \$143.21. Total amount, \$64,508.48... Along the Water Front... The schooner Albert Meyer sailed from the Union mill today for San Pedro... The schooner Philippine is loading at the Union mill for San Pedro... The schooner Winslow is at the Michigan mill, loading for San Francisco... The schooner Sequoia sailed yesterday from the West & Slade mill for Oakland... The schooner Wm. F. Witzeman sailed yesterday from the Union mill for Redondo... The schooner Rustler is loading at the West & Slade mill for Southern California ports... The brig Geneva arrived in port Monday, and is loading at the Wilson mill for Australia... The schooner San Beneventura is at the Aberdeen Lumber & Shingle mills loading for San Francisco... The steamer G. C. Lindauer arrived in port Tuesday, and is loading at the Wilson mill for San Francisco... The steamer Coronado arrived in port yesterday, and is loading at the Anderson & Middleton mill for San Pedro... The steamer Newburg sailed this morning from West & Slade mill for San Francisco, carrying a large passenger list... The schooner Metoer is at the Lindstrom shipyards undergoing repairs, after which she will load at the Aberdeen Lumber & Shingle mills for San Pedro.

THE CITY COUNCIL TRANSACTED QUITE A LOT OF BUSINESS LAST EVENING... Will Plank Heron Street With Four-Inch Plank. Fuel Sheds Allowed in Fire District. A Cow Ordinance Introduced. Will Consider City Hall Plans Tonight... The business of two weeks was attended to by the city council last night with the utmost dispatch. The first thing on the table was a suggestion that the city pay the expenses of the fire chief to the annual convention of Pacific Coast Fire Chiefs. The council did not consider the possible benefits equal to the cost and turned the proposition down... A resolution was adopted allowing the erection of fuel sheds in the fire district. The sheds, not larger than 15x20 feet, must be of iron walls and roof and have four-inch floors... The contract between the city and James Stewart for additional water rights was signed, and a warrant ordered drawn for the first payment... The clerk was directed to procure some necessary supplies for his and the engineer's office... County Auditor Campbell notified the council that the assessed valuation of Aberdeen was \$1,192,672, and requested to be informed of the tax levy as soon as possible. Referred to the finance committee... T. E. Haynes was allowed to remove some earth, as requested, on Second street... The reports of the city officers were referred to the committees... The report of Supt. Linn for September was read and filed. The report showed the operating expenses of the water works, \$480.43; cost of extensions, \$7,629.05; cost of street cleaning, \$38.25; street repairing, \$103.20... A petition from Heron street property owners for a four-inch plank street from the bridge westward was referred to the street committee... Chas. Potts asked that his discharge from the position of assistant engineer be investigated, but the council declined to interfere with Engineer Bowen in the matter... A request for a six-inch main to the Western mill was referred to the water committee... Ed. Dolan made formal demand upon the city for the collection of certain street improvement taxes, for which he held the warrants. Referred to the attorney... Saloon licenses were granted to M. Kaufmann and J. A. Moller... The protest of A. Hle, Mrs. W. Byng and Wm. Schultz against the improvement of N street, was referred to the street committee... Councilman Leitch introduced an ordinance prohibiting stock to run at large. Referred to street committee... Ordinances were passed for a sidewalk on Garfield street, between Heron and Home, and for planking E street, between Wishkah and First... Sherwood reported that the city hall committee had five sets of plans for a city hall, and the council will meet this evening to consider them... The clerk was directed to call the attention of the Grays Harbor Electric Co. to the provision of its franchise requiring certain street lights, and Supt. Linn was instructed to have the company fill up the space between its tracks on Market street... The contract for a road to the new water works dam was let to S. Shryock & Son for 24 cents per foot... Supt. Linn was directed to present a bill for \$20 to Harrison Bros. for damage done to the city dock... The roll of special improvement district 110 was equalized, and that of 115 referred to Sherwood and Jones... Supt. Linn was directed to build retaining wall in front of the Crawford and Hart properties on B street, as had been agreed upon... The attorney was directed to prepare a contract for Hillgoss & Ladue, giving them 45 days to complete road to water works... A vote of thanks was given to the police force and police court for the manner in which the peace of the city is being maintained, and the laws enforced... A bill of the Aberdeen Livery & Transfer Co., for \$4.75, for wood, was referred back for the O. K. of party receiving the wood, and a bill of Dr. Schumacher, for \$10 for disinfecting, was referred to the attorney. The bill of \$72.25, of R. S. Jackson was referred back for correction, and a cost bill from Judge Nims, Cosmopolis was referred to the attorney. All other bills were allowed.
