
CHERRY MINE HORROR.

Rare Heroism Shown at the Great Illinois Disaster. The recent mine disaster at Cherry Hill, Ill., when 400 miners lost their lives, is a horror beyond words in its pathos, and the heroic deeds performed during the terrible affair will never be forgotten. Fully realizing that the chances were ninety-nine out of a hundred against them, the rescue parties lost not a moment in entering the burning pit and tried to save their fellow men. Outside the mine the scenes were the most pitiable ever attending a disaster of this kind. The fire, it is claimed, was caused by a careless miner throwing a lighted torch on a load of hay. There it smoldered till it burst into flame, when an effort to carry it out resulted in an explosion of gases, and the disaster followed. Radical changes are now being advocated to prevent such great loss of life in further horrors of this kind.

MRS. AUGUSTA E. STETSON. Early Career of the Deposed Christian Science Leader. Mrs. Augusta E. Stetson, whose controversy with the mother church of Christian Science resulted in her excommunication, was born in Maine and when very young married the son of a Boston shipbuilder, who acted as his father's broker. For nearly ten years Mrs. Stetson and her husband wandered over the earth until she be-

came almost as familiar with the far east as with Europe. Nineteen years ago Mrs. Stetson became a disciple of Mrs. Eddy, being one of the earliest to adopt the tenets of the founder of Christian Science, and was sent to New York. Surely no missionary could have suffered from a greater handicap. To begin with, she knew not a soul in all New York. There were three or four followers of Mrs. Eddy in the city, but Mrs. Stetson had never met them. Mrs. Stetson worked with enthusiasm. During her first year in New York she had some twenty or thirty patients. She lived in different places, hotels like the Brunswick and the Buckingham chiefly, and extended her acquaintance. She gave parlor talks and went about socially. At the end of her first year in New York she organized the first Christian Science church there and since then became second in favor to Mrs. Eddy.
