

SALMON RUN IS LARGE

The run of salmon during the past week has reached its highest mark in years. Monday more than 10,000 fish were delivered to the Hoquiam Packing company cannery. The greatest part of this catch was made in the company's traps, yet every incoming boat brings in hundreds of fish. At the two local canneries, thousands of fish are being received. The catch averages 100 to the boat. The run of dog salmon, which generally precedes a run of silversides, is over and local packers are looking for plenty of fish during the next two weeks, when the season's catch will be caught up with last year's figures.
