NOTICE OF ELECTION ABERDEEN
SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 5, FOR
VALUATION AND ASSESSMENT AND
FUNDING SAME

RESOLUTION
WHEREAS, It appears to the Board
of Directors of the Aberdeen School
District No. 5, Chehalis County, Wash-
ington, that there is outstanding against
said Aberdeen School District No. 5,
a general fund warrant indebtedness
amounting to \$96,035.33, principal, upon
general fund warrants heretofore is-
sued and outstanding and unpaid, in-
cluding Warrants Nos. 4367, issued Oc-
tober 15, 1912, to 5794, issued October
25, 1913, inclusive, all of said war-
rants aggregating the aforesaid sum of
\$96,035.33.

AND WHEREAS Doubt exists as to
the validity of said warrants and of the
indebtedness represented thereby,
the only ground of invalidity of such
warrants being that at the time of
the incurring or attempted incurring
thereof, the same, together with all
other then existing indebtedness of
said School District may have exceeded
one and one-half per centum of the
taxable property in said School Dis-
trict.

AND WHEREAS It is desired to sub-
mit to the electors of said Aberdeen
School District No. 5 the questions of

and validation of the incurring and at-
tempted incurring by said Aberdeen
School District No. 5 of all of the gen-
eral fund warrants indebtedness of said
Aberdeen School District No. 5 repre-
sented by general fund warrants Nos.
4367 to 5794, inclusive, issued October
15, 1912, and October 25, 1913, in-
clusive, being of the face value or
amount of \$96,035.33, besides interest
thereon, concerning which indebtedness
question may, and does exist as to the
validity thereof and the only ground
of the invalidity of such indebtedness
is that at the time of the incurring
thereof, the same, together with all
other then existing indebtedness of
said Aberdeen School District No. 5, may
have exceeded one and one-half per
centum of the taxable property in said
School District.

That there shall also be
submitted to the qualified electors of
said Aberdeen School District No. 5, at
said election, the question of the
validation and ratification of the in-
curring and attempted incurring by
said Aberdeen School District No. 5,
of all of the general fund warrants
numbered 4367 to 5794, inclusive, is-
sued October 15, 1912, and October 25,
1913, inclusive, in the event that said
warrant indebtedness shall be validated
at said election, but in case said gen-
eral fund warrant indebtedness shall not
be ratified and validated at said election,
then this proposition to fund and re-
fund said warrant indebtedness shall
be null and void; that said funding shall
be accomplished by the issuance of
interest-bearing negotiable coupon bonds
to the amount of said general fund war-
rants and interest thereon, and to an

HEALTH HINT FOR TODAY.

The Uses of Fruit.
A healthy person should always eat fruit in the raw state. For those who are ill or delicate the fruit should be stewed. The acids which are sometimes present in very large quantities in apples—especially the sour varieties—render them rather injurious to the stomach, and the sweet and juicy varieties are more easily digested. Apples are also beneficial in diabetes and are more digestible when stewed. The juice of the apple is a very beneficial drink.
In general, pears are not easily digested, as they contain hard, gritty and indigestible granules. They are more digestible by cooking. Apricots and peaches should only be eaten when perfectly ripe, in which manner they are easily digested. Among peaches the free stone varieties are best digested. The cling stones are not to be recommended for weak stomachs. Fresh raw plums, prunes and green grapes are well digested when they are ripe and tender. However, plums and prunes, even when taken in large quantities, are more healthful than green grapes. Cherries and grapes, too, are two of the most beneficial fruits, and both may be freely partaken of in season.
