


Splendors of the Panama-Pacific International Exposition Forecasted In Marvels of Art and Architecture

PANORAMA of about one-fourth of the Panama-Pacific International Exposition, showing nine of the great exhibit palaces which are now within 5 per cent of being complete, lacking only the towers, arches and festival courts. Each of these palaces covers from five to nine acres. The setting in a series of subtropical gardens, extending for two and one-half miles along the San Francisco bay front adjacent to the Golden Gate, is the most beautiful and inspiring ever given an exposition. The vacant space in the center will contain the wonderful ten acre Court of the Universe, dominated by the scintillating Tower of Jewels, 435 feet high. To the right, not shown in the picture, is the concession area, named "El Camino", while to the left, outside the picture, are foreign and state buildings, live stock pavilions, race track, military and aviation fields and Palace of Fine Arts.

SCIENTISTS TO CHART OCEAN

Stackhouse Expedition Will Make Soundings Where the Titanic Sank. J. Foster Stackhouse's expedition, originally intended for antarctic exploration, has developed into a scheme for surveying, sounding and charting the ocean on a scale which is asserted, has not been approached since the famous Challenger expedition of 1872-76.

Mr. Stackhouse, explaining his plans, said: "We shall start next December, and the voyage will last six or seven years. The route will be London to Iceland, thence across the Atlantic to Nova Scotia, taking soundings on the way upon the site of the Titanic disaster."

"The task of sounding the Pacific will become one of the utmost importance with the opening of the Panama canal to shipping.

"The members of our expedition will number twelve scientists, with six of them and eighteen or nineteen sailors will have sign-on for seven years."

RAIN BY WIRELESS.

Weather Control—rain ordered for midnight, day after tomorrow—may be a wireless victory in the next generation. Now it is weird and visionary, but Sir Oliver Lodge, who is in the top rank of living scientists, thinks it not improbable and is now calling on his fellows to begin wireless studies with this purpose in mind.

The more there is discovered about the way wireless telegraphy works the more it is evident that weather and wireless waves are tangled with each other.

Almost every one knows that wireless telegraphy works better by night than by day and has peculiar jumps of efficiency at sunset. A wireless operator on shipboard in the far north found that during a display of the aurora borealis the northern lights were wildly disturbed when he sent out wireless signals from his ship.

The growing theory concerning the way wireless waves follow the curve of the earth is in simple language that the upper layers of the air form a sort of magnetic cushion against which the wireless waves can bound along. Sir Oliver wishes to have experiments made by discharging very powerful wireless waves from kites under all kinds of weather conditions in order to ascertain whether the waves under any conditions make clouds condense into rain or prevent them from condensing.

It is not to be expected, of course, that rain could be obtained from a dry sky, but normal conditions of the air would leave much opportunity for weather control if the theory should prove workable.

The total eclipse of the sun on a path from Greenland to Persia next August is to be made the occasion for elaborate wireless experiments. Wireless signals will be sent out from within the path of shadow and across the shadow, and the effect of the shadow on these signals should give more clues to the whole problem.—Saturday Evening Post.

EGAN, THE BOMB MAN.

No One Else on Earth Has a Job Just Like This New Yorker. Owen Egan, an inspector of New York's bureau of combustibles, has opened, analyzed and destroyed over 5,000 bombs in nineteen years of uninterrupted and dangerous duty. He receives a salary of \$1,500 a year, and no one has ever offered to succeed him when he quits. No life insurance company will take a risk on him, and if he is injured while opening a bomb he cannot sue the city for damages. There isn't another job like his in the world. Following is an extract from an article in the American Magazine:

"The 'bomb industry' in New York began to be a serious menace ten years ago, but in those days Egan had an hour or two to himself. Nowadays bombs are coming so fast he calls up the bureau of combustibles every half hour to let one of the three bosses know where he is. To show the increasing popularity of Black Hand extortion, Egan handled only thirteen bombs in 1908, while last year there were 145, with a property damage estimated at \$17,430, an increase of ninety-three over 1912.

"And every one of the unexploded bombs found is capable of blowing Egan to smithereens were it not for the care he takes to safeguard his life. Once he has literally picked a bomb apart and has supplied the police with working clues he unconsciously finds himself the enemy of the very men who make bombs. Yet, cognizant of that fact, he carries no revolver for protection, and the only means he uses to elude the vengeance is to keep his whereabouts secret. You won't find his name, address or telephone number in any directory, and long ago he discarded the use of mail boxes."


