### GRAY'S HARBOR RAILWAY & LIGHT COMPANY

The Grays Harbor Railway & Light Co., which serves Aberdeen, Hoquiam, and Cosmopolis, with light, heat and power, is one of the many public service corporations nowadays whose constant endeavor is to merit the good will of the people whom it serves.


The company's current is produced by two separate plants with a combined generating capacity of 260 Kilowatts which is equivalent to 3552 horse power. These two plants are located in different parts of the city and are interconnected in such a manner that in case of breakdowns, at either plant, the other would take care of the load. This insures reliability or service impossible to obtain from a single plant.

The company also enjoys another advantage in having the generating plants located within the territory

the whole imbedded in a heavy mass of reinforced concrete. This is the highest class of construction which can be put in, and is of a much more expensive and permanent nature than construction in other cities in the neighborhood.

The payroll is about \$10,000.00 per month, besides this amount being distributed locally, a large portion of all supplies used are purchased in the local market including ground up mill waste secured from the sawmills which is used for fuel and fed to the boilers by automatic machinery. This waste would otherwise be consumed in the slab burners of the saw mills, and thereby be a total loss instead of a source of revenue to the mills.

The Grays Harbor Railway & Light Co. will pay in taxes during this year in excess of \$30,000. It is very interesting to note that this amount is in

served as it prevents the interruptions of service by breakdowns in transmission lines caused by falling trees, etc., which so frequently occur with lighting companies receiving their current from water power plants located a considerable distance from the community served.

The street railway system consists of approximately 15 miles of track, a large portion of which is now on improved streets. On account of the unstable nature of the soil in the tide flat districts, the cost of laying a permanent track is very expensive, especially in improved streets. To overcome this difficulty the company has constructed its tracks of heavy steel rails fastened to steel ties, and

excess of the total cost of street lighting, and electricity for municipal buildings, and operating several municipal motors paid for by the cities of Hoquiam, Aberdeen and Cosmopolis. In other words, the Grays Harbor Railway & Light Co. returns to the cities of Hoquiam, Aberdeen, and Cosmopolis in the form of taxes the total amount which these cities pay for electric current for street lighting and all other purposes.

In view of the amounts paid out by the Grays Harbor Railway & Light Co. in taxes, pay roll and local purchases of material and the quality of service rendered, Grays Harbor is to be congratulated upon being served by them.




