Of the work of Professor Dimond, Seattle pianist, there can be but one opinion. It has been consistently good since his first public appearance many years ago. One number to be given by Dimond here will be new to Grays Harbor musicians—a rendition with the left hand, alone, of the sextet from Lucia di Lammermoor.

Professor Dimond is a native of the United States but he received his musical education abroad. He studied in Paris and Berlin, and was a pupil of Barth, of Moszkowski and of Josefey. The Berlin Lokal Anzeiger on April 14, 1904, had this to say of his work:

"Louis Dimond proved beyond doubt that he is a remarkable pianist. He played the Rubenstein concerto No. 4 in D minor and demonstrated that he is the possessor of a remarkable technique. In the slow movements his tone was lovely and his interpretation most musical."

A week later Professor Dimond was in Paris, and the Figaro of April 20 says: "Prof. Dimond has the right to claim the title, 'master pianist.' His interpretation of the Brahms sonata in F minor was masterly. In the Liszt Rhapsodie and Chopin studies he showed his clear, easy, wonderful technique."

With these two artists in solo numbers, with choruses and other massed effects from the male voice and with a number or two furnished by some woman vocalist of Aberdeen, a concert of distinction will be given by the local musical organization
