### COUNCIL MAKES FEW OTHER BUDGET CUTS

By Slicing Off \$9,260, Total Cut of \$28,580 is Made and 20 Mill Levy Rendered Possible.

A total of \$28,580 was cut from the city's budget at the final session of the city council of several held for that purpose, Friday, and councilmen gathered last night for the regular weekly meeting freed at last from the trouble of weeds.

The largest single item in the cuts, Friday night, was \$4,315.40 for bonded indebtedness. The \$500 set aside for enforcing the dry law was cut out, and the total cuts were \$9,640. By these, the hated occupation tax was eliminated and the amount to be raised by direct taxation reduced to \$147,029.20. The levy will be about 20 mills.

### BUSINESS SECTION OF WESTPORT DESTROYED

Kerosene in Vacant Cottage Starts Incendiary Fire that Wipes Out Most of Beach Resort.

All of the business section of Westport that was left after the fire of a week ago Tuesday, was wiped out Friday night in a second fire. The conflagration started in an unoccupied cottage owned by W. R. Dibkey and swept off postoffice, Swaney's drug store and Callison's general merchandise store. The Raymond building was saved. The loss from this second fire is about \$5,000. Plans already are afoot to rebuild the burned section.

### BIG TERRITORY OPEN TO HARBOR LUMBER

Interstate Commerce Commission Makes Order Effective That Helps Local Lumber Industry

An order of the interstate commerce commission, that became effective Monday, allows to Aberdeen and other Grays Harbor mills the same freight rates to Idaho and Salt Lake territory that are enjoyed by Portland and other Oregon mills. This means the opening of a huge territory to local lumber manufacturers.

Until this week local mills have been compelled to pay a differential of 2½ cents per 100 pounds over the Portland territory. This partially was prohibitive.
