JEWISH DAY OF ATONEMENT

Will Be Observed This Evening and Tomorrow.

At sunset today begins Yom Kippur, the Jewish Day of Atonement. At 4 o'clock all Jewish stores will close, not to reopen until 6 o'clock tomorrow afternoon.

The congregation of Bikur, which is the orthodox Jewish church, will worship at Morris hall. The services tomorrow morning will begin at 8 o'clock. Again at noon the worship will commence, lasting until 3 o'clock.

The congregation of the Temple de Hirsch celebrates Yom Kippur in Jefferson theater. Rabbi Theodore Joseph will conduct the services, which will begin at 7:30 o'clock this evening with the solemn prayer of Kol Nidre, which will be repeated three times, during which the congregation prays itself.

ANNUAL REPORT ON MARINE ACCIDENTS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 12.—The annual report of Gen. Dumont, the supervising inspector general of steamboat inspection, shows that the total number of accidents to steam vessels during the year was 48, of which seven were from fire, thirteen collisions, eight breaking steam pipes, two explosions, and eight from snags, wrecks and sinking.

Hot Summer in London.

LONDON, Sept. 12.—So far as is known this is the hottest summer ever experienced in London. Meteorological records go back only 27 years, and show a maximum of 90 degrees in the shade. The heat is accompanied by full humidity.
