

EXPLOSION IN A MINE

Many Men Reported to Be Entombed.

Brownsville, Pa., Dec. 21.—An explosion occurred in Brazzall mine this morning. Sixty men are reported to be entombed. The explosion was terrific, and the mine was plainly at Brownsville. The shaft is totally wrecked and the miners are rendered helpless. The cage was with terrific force to the top of the shaft, and it then fell back to the bottom, completely blocking the mine. The explosion is supposed to be on fire, and a large volume of smoke hinders the entrance of the rescue parties. There is very little, if any, hope for the men yet in the mine. The mine is in such shape that the rescue work cannot be worked. This prevents the opening of fresh air to the entombed men. It is thought they are all dead, as the bad air and smoke issuing from the mine indicates a terrible condition inside.
