REPPENERS STILL COUNTING HER DEAD Conservative Estimates Now Place the Loss of Life at Not Less Than 250---Search for Bodies Still Progresses---Supplies for the Homeless and Destitute Reach Stricken City

REPPENERS. Of June 20.—The bodies of the victims so far recovered number 250. This number will probably be increased today and tomorrow by at least two scores, making a total of 200 now recovered. The most conservative estimates now place the total number of victims at not less than 250, though it is conceded that the total may reach as high as 500.

6,000 KILLED A Disastrous Battle Between the Moorish Troops and Tribesmen Said to Have Taken Place

LONDON, June 20.—A Dispatch has just been received from Tangier stating that a bloody conflict has taken place between Moorish troops and tribesmen at Ainnedinna. The Moorish general and 6,000 men are reported to have been killed in the battle.

FIRST GOLD FROM DAWSON HAS ARRIVED Humboldt Arrived This Morning With \$250,000 in Dust and Nuggets Owned By 65 Dawson Passengers

Gold dust valued at not less than \$250,000 reached Seattle this morning on the steamer Humboldt, the first treasure ship of the season. Of her 16 passengers 65 were from the Klondike and all brought out "pokes" of gold dust and nuggets ranging in value from a few thousand to \$40,000.

GREET THE LIBERTY BELL


