

MISS GOELET GIVES HER MILLIONS FOR A TITLE

CHARMING YOUNG HEIRESS WILL BECOME THE DUCHESS OF ROXBURGH, TONIGHT—THE WEDDING WILL BE SIMPLE, THOUGH ELEGANT—BRIDE IS IN MOURNING

NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—Miss May Goelet will be united in marriage at 6:30 o'clock tonight in the Protestant Episcopal church of St. Thomas to Sir Henry John Innes-Ker, Duke of Roxburgh, Marquis of Bowmont and Cessford, Earl of Roxburgh, Earl of Kelso, Viscount Blythswood, Baron Roxburgh and Baron Ker of Cessford and Caverton in Scotland, Earl Innes in the United Kingdom, and a baronet of Nova Scotia.

The ceremony will be performed by Rt. Rev. William Crosswell Doane, bishop of Albany, assisted by Rev. Ernest M. Stivers, rector of St. Thomas church, and Rev. Dr. Huntington of Grace church.

The duke ranks 19th in the line of British dukes, it being the 19th in the order of creation. The dukedom of Roxburgh was created in 1707. The present duke succeeded to his title in 1892. He was reported for bravery in the Boer war and in 1902 was made Knight of the Thistle for bravery in this war.
