

THE IROQUOIS THEATER WILL REACH 700

Already 591 Bodies Have Been Removed From the Ruins of the Iroquois Theater and the List Is Rapidly Growing—The Injured Will Number 250

Difference of Opinion As to the Cause of the Fire—All Fire Protective Apparatus Proved Inefficient—The Work of Rescue

CHICAGO, Ill., Dec. 31.—At 9 o'clock this morning the police compiled a list of bodies recovered from the Iroquois holocaust. They have found 591, with a prospect of finding other bodies in the debris. It is almost certain that the number will exceed 600.

Coroner Treagar still believes that the total will reach 700, as the basement, upper dressing rooms of the stage and upper galleries have not been thoroughly searched.

At the city hall, where the lists of victims and descriptions of the unidentified dead are being compiled, men, women and children through the corridors.

The death list is being added to by the hospital reports, where the injured were taken. The police believe that at least 250 were injured.

Pumps are working on the basement, which was flooded. On every step and on all floors in the building the police find diamonds, other jewels and furs. No one is permitted to enter the building without a special permit from the chief of police, and then he must be accompanied by a special guard.

Thousands of dollars worth of wraps and jewels have been hauled to police headquarters. The rear and side walls of the stage are in danger of falling.

Architects today warned the firemen that the rear of the building might collapse at any moment and crush to death all in that portion. William Dea, a wealthy contractor, whose two children, Edward, aged 6, and Louise, aged 3, and their nurse, are missing, chartered a special train last night in which to come from Indiana. Today he brought his nurse and Louise. The latter was picked up crying in the streets in front of the theater. The nurse is badly injured at a hospital. The boy is missing.

CHICAGO, Dec. 31.—When the last day of the year dawned this grief-stricken city, stunned by the appalling magnitude of the holocaust at the Iroquois theater yesterday afternoon, realized that for the second time it had received a baptism of fire, and that hundreds of its men, young women and children had had their lives snuffed out in less than half an hour.

When the department finally succeeded in extinguishing the flames in the ill-fated playhouse the result was seen to be much more appalling than was at first reported. Every minute, every hour, brought forth news of fresh disaster, of added horror and the list of the dead continued to increase until various estimates placed it between 500 and 600. Fire department, coroner and newspapers all differ. Reports of the missing failed to agree and it will be some time before the number of the dead can be positively determined. The number of the injured is also a matter of doubt at this time.

THE SCENES AT THE MORGUES MAKE BRAVE HEARTS QUAIL

CHICAGO, Dec. 31.—Not until today, when harrowing scenes at the many city morgues of such a nature as to unnerve even the most hardened, was it possible to get any conception of the enormity of yesterday's catastrophe. The mangled, distorted and shapeless bodies laid in long rows with pathways between, through which men and women and now and then children were allowed to pass their sick with fear that they would find a missing loved one there, was in itself an infinite tragedy. Then add to the scene the pitiful cries heard as some mother, father, sister or brother discovered a trampled corpse that they thought was that of a loved one, and the undertakers' assistants, pallid to the face, and waiting for a chance to stand by and witness without a tremor. While such scenes as these were enacted in the temporary home of the dead, no less dramatic were the scenes among the crowds without yearning to get inside. It was the story of grief-stricken men and women who were pleading for a piece of the bodies to be returned to them by daylight.

On the first floor and reached the first and second balconies. It was here that the greatest number of the audience were seated and it is probable that with a few exceptions, all of the dead in the upper part of the house were killed before they even had a chance to make a dash for escape. Those who were the younger males, mad rush for the exits, trampling the children underfoot, but few reached the doors. In the second balcony the incline in every stage almost as much as in the first. Women and children were unable to fight their way upward before the flames completely enveloped them. In the first row of the first balcony, where the flames evidently reached first, scores of people were found dead seated in their chairs facing the audience.

In the meantime, the people on the first floor were struggling to gain the regular and the fire exits. It is declared by many of the survivors that some of the latter were locked and the weight of the terror-stricken people was hurled against the doors, bursting them from their hinges.

Today there is but one thought—the realization of the awful mortality and the fact that the fire was the most disastrous in the history of this country; that the majority of the victims were young women and children, that the destruction was so swift and so terrible that they had practically no chance to help themselves.

While the accounts of the fire, its cause and progress are somewhat conflicting, the stories told by the survivors are in the main consistent. The fire was first discovered "up stage," or near the back wall of the theater. Many of the company were assembled on the stage and the existence of the fire was not known until an effort had been made to extinguish it. The city fireman, stationed in the theater during every performance, was on the stage at the time and when called to the assistance of the stage hands, attempted to extinguish what was then a mere tongue of flame with a patent apparatus known as "kifire" and two of these tubes were used, but apparently had no effect. The flames crept up the chimney and stage paraphernalia, and the audience was first made aware of its danger by a strong smell of burning canvas. Then a great puff of smoke shot out from under the proscenium arch. Immediately the stage was thrown into confusion. Members of the chorus and principals, most of whom were women, screamed and ran into the wings. Eddie Foy, the leading comedian of the company, was the first to see the danger and called to the audience to leave the theater quietly, as there was no immediate danger. A second cloud of smoke half filled the auditorium and the fire started from its seats. The fire then spread in a half way and then stopped. In an incredible short space of time the smoke gave way to flames. The half dropped curtain and the open doors in front of the stage were the main points of fire.

By means of the undertakers had arranged the bodies regularly in rows of 20 deep with pathways like furrows between, and great through-steps to the exits, a few at a time, under police guidance.

On account of the surging mass of humanity that had stood without the doors in the bitter cold all night, waiting for a chance to claim the bodies, the undertakers had not taken time to make less gruesome scenes of the horrible sight, and throughout the entire morning the police and undertakers' attendants were kept busy reviving men and women who fell fainting at the awful sight that met their gaze. Similar scenes were enacted at Jordan's place, on Madison street,

where there were 129 bodies; at Sheldon's, on West Madison street, where 41 bodies were strewn on the floor and tables; at Carroll's, on Wells street, where there were 41 bodies; at Buffum's, on Washburn avenue, where 31 bodies were arranged for identification; at Perrigo's, on State street, where there were 29, and at smaller undertaking establishments in the various parts of the city.

Heart-rending scenes attending the identification of bodies are so numerous that it would take many columns to even begin to tell of them. In one instance there was the body of a high school girl. Her clothing was torn about her waist and her face and the whole upper part of her body was trampled into a mass of flesh that almost belied the fact that it ever wore the dainty features of a young girl budding into womanhood. A mother stopped, picked up the body of the slender hands and fell back with a piercing cry into a dead faint. On the hand the attendants found a little ring and within was inscribed "To Flora from Mamma, Xmas, 1932." That told the whole story. The woman had found her child. There are many other bodies in a
