REED SMOOT COMPLETES THE TRIO AND HE IS NOT SAFELY ANCHORED THERE YET



SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, April 29.—Three prominent Mormons, including Reed Smoot, have tried to enter congress. The first was Moses W. Thatcher, an apostle, who ran for the senate. He failed to secure the church's consent. It defeated him and deposed him from his position.

Then came Brigham H. Roberts, who was elected to the lower house of congress, but was denied his seat because he practiced polygamy at the time he was elected.

And now comes Smoot.

POLICEMEN FOR PARKS

BOARD AGREES UPON A PLAN FOR APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL OFFICERS

The park board last night agreed upon a plan for stationing fifteen or twenty uniformed special policemen in the city parks to maintain order and to prevent vandalism that has been going on in some of them. In addition, one special officer is to be hired at a salary not exceeding \$75 per month to devote his entire time to preventing infractions of the city ordinances and rules in the parks. The special will act in conjunction with the regular patrolmen when necessary, as in case of riot.

The board severely criticized the Seattle and other corporations owning poles in the city for their indiscriminate destruction of shade trees in the parking strips, while poles are being erected. Letters will be addressed to each corporation asking that steps be taken to instruct the working gangs to protect the trees hereafter.

The billboard nuisance was also discussed, but no action was taken.


