

# POOL ROOM MEN TALK

Claim No Question of Morals Was Considered by Western Union

Seattle poolroom gamblers are still up in the air as a result of the order issued by the president of the Western Union Telegraph Company last Wednesday discontinuing the poolroom service that has been furnished over that company's wires. Not a bet has been registered, either in this city or Georgetown, since the order went into effect, and all the poolroom magnates and touts can do is to stand around and speculate as to what the outcome will be if the Western Union stands pat on the position it has taken. The local manager of the telegraph company said yesterday that he knew nothing about the order, or what would be done in the future.

"We have been advised to discontinue the service. That is all we know about it," he declared. The local poolroom proprietors are of the opinion that the order will put every poolroom in the country out of business, at least for the present. While a racing report syndicate might be formed to report the result of the races, they say the poolrooms could not afford to take chances in operating on this basis. If such a syndicate were formed, and if it could get a low commercial rate from one of the two big telegraph companies, the messages giving the reports of the races would have to be filed like other private telegrams, and would have to risk being delayed like other commercial messages.

It can readily be seen that a poolroom operating with such a service would run the risk of having some outsider beat it every day by receiving information first from the tracks. The poolroom men have a story to tell as to the cause of the order discontinuing the poolroom service. They say it was not actuated by any high moral question, but came about as a result of the discovery by the telegraph company that it was being beaten at its own game. In New York recently, it is stated, the company discovered that about 100 poolrooms were being supplied with a track report and the company was getting pay from but one poolroom.

It seems some crafty man was getting and paying for the report for one poolroom, and was relaying the report out to scores of other poolrooms over a private wire. This was but one of the many
