# TIVERTON WON THE CHARTER OAK STAKES

HARTFORD, Conn., Sept. 8.—In the presence of 20,000 people Tiverton won the best out of two heats in the Charter Oak stake race for a purse of \$10,000. Tiverton won the first and third heats, both in 2:07 1/2. Dr. Strong created a sensation by winning the second heat in 2:07 1/2, thus equalling the fastest time ever made in this event.

Sweet Marie, the favorite, came in for money on second heat winners only. The division of the stake was as follows: \$2,000 to each heat winner, \$300 to each second horse, \$600 to third in first heat, \$600 to third horses in second and third heats.

# AMENDMENTS MADE TO AUTOMOBILE LAW

Herman Chapin and other enthusiastic chauffeurs, who have organized an automobile club, appeared before the streets committee yesterday afternoon and succeeded in securing several amendments to the automobile ordinance. They claimed that the ordinance as it had been framed would kill off the "sport," requiring too many restrictions. They succeeded in getting the speed limit up to eight miles an hour on uphill grades, four miles an hour down hill and ten miles an hour on the level.

A slower speed than this, they said, would make automobiling a burden. They also succeeded in cutting out several provisions providing for the arrest of reckless motorists. In return for all these favors from the council members of the club agreed to aid the police in "jerk" all violators of the ordinance.

# KICKS ON TAXES

County Auditor Lamping and County Commissioner Baker went to Olympia today to ask that \$750,000 be taken off the assessed valuation of the city of Seattle, for the reason that the real property in the city has been assessed at more than 60 per cent of its real valuation, in order to enable the completion of local improvements. The county commissioners claim that it would be unfair for the state to assess taxes on King county realty on the high valuation, returned by the board of equalization.
