As a result of the raid on a gambling game conducted in the Washington building some months ago the police have accomplished but one thing, the destruction of the gambling apparatus. This took place at the police station Saturday afternoon. Chief of Police Delaney was offered \$10 for the roulette wheel shortly before the work of depopulation set in, but he declined the offer which included some arrangement for police "protection." Although the case against the gamblers was the strongest possible and would have resulted in a conviction if laid before a jury. It was dismissed for lack of evidence in the lower court. The inside history of the case is known to but a few and they are breathing easy now for the first time in many months.

**HIGH SCHOOL WANTS JUICE**

The manual training department of the high school is going to secure its electric power from the city. Prof. B. W. Johnson, supervisor of the department, has al-

most important change in the equipment of these articles is the elimination of granulated cork used in their manufacture. The rules now state that the cork used shall be solid and shall weigh fully six pounds. There are many other minor changes specified in regard to the material for straps and the manner of sewing on the covering. The amendments enacted in regard to the equipment of two life boats also call for many new additions to the paraphernalia now required. Inspector of Hulls and Boilers, Whitney and Turner announced that their rules would go into effect at once. They stated but very few of the local vessels would be affected to any great extent by the changes, as nearly all of them were equipped according to the law.
