Komura Again Prepares To Slight the Queen City

SENIOR JAPANESE ENVOY WILL SPEND BUT ONE NIGHT IN SEATTLE BEFORE LEAVING AMERICA—DOES NOT CARE FOR COURTESIES FROM LOCAL MEN

Baron Jutaro Komura has announced the plans for his return trip to Japan, and again he condescends to give Seattle only a very few hours of his time.

Seattle's Japanese are feeling the slight, and, although in their stoical way they say little, they think much.

When the baron arrived here on the steamship Minnesota he remained in Seattle but a few hours, claiming lack of time, and would not attend a banquet which the Japanese association and citizens of the city were anxious to prepare in his honor.

Now, after his work is done, he is visiting New York, Boston and other eastern cities, and plans to stop in St. Paul during September 16, but will not arrive in Seattle until the evening of the 19th. As he will sail on the steamship Dakota, which is to leave early on the morning of September 20, it is obvious that he will have little time here for banqueting. He announces

HOO HOOS HAVE A HOT TIME

The 140 visiting Hoo Hoos and their families had a merry time in Seattle Wednesday. They were given a scenic trip through the city, a ride on the lake, and taken to the Moran shipyards.

Later they enjoyed a banquet at the Hotel Washington, and an informal reception took up the remainder of their time. They left at 10 o'clock for Tacoma, where they remained until noon Thursday. Then they took the train for Portland, reaching that city in time for the big "concentration" Friday.

The Chamber of Commerce has appointed a special committee for the purpose of trying to prevail upon the county commissioners to raise \$80,000 towards the expense

of the proposed army building. The state appropriated \$30,000 and the county was to appropriate the balance. The plan is to have the commissioners raise the money either by direct taxation or by an issue of bonds and create a sinking fund with which to meet them when they mature.
