"SPITBALL"

Puts Many Twirlers To the Bad

Constant Use of Spitball Puts Pitchers Out of Business

It is probably easier for me to throw what the vulgar have called the "spit" ball than to tell how it is done. No pitcher has succeeded in gaining perfect control of these cultivated slants, and I have perhaps had as much success with the delivery as any pitcher in the National League.

These dampened shots are simply allowed to slide off the tips of the moistened first and second fingers. The ball has much more speed than can be put into an ordinary curve sent from a twisting grasp. It is possible to put more steam, however, behind a straight fist ball. No one, however, has been able to fathom the queer drop of the

sprayed shot, and many a catcher is tattooed by thumbs of the elusive leather crashing into spots not armored. I would not advise any pitcher who wants to use this arm a good many years to depend solely upon spit balls. They are greater jugglers when you have the batsman so pinched that you can take a longer chance than he can. The mystery of the movement of the spit ball is too deep a problem for me to attempt to solve. It is delivered with the same movement used in the pitching of any other ball. My first successful experiment with the delivery was against Boston last year, and I've counted it my best pitching asset ever since.
