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
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BIG SI MORGAN GOES BACK TO THE MINORS

"Si" Morgan, the boxman with the half-past six o'clock build and good intentions, comes up in Minneapolis last season and just deuces in St. Louis this campaign, has got his annual transfer from Manager McAleer of the Browns.

Indianapolis got him and very likely Morgan will be a gigantic success of Ed. Barrow. "Si" is a "morning glory." In the morning practice each day Fred

Among Penn's best men are Stevenson, who made the All-American team, and Reynolds. Other players are Sinker and Weede, ends; Lamson and Rook, tackles; Ziegler and Junk, guards; ex-Capt. Torrey and Williams, center; Stevenson and Johnson, quarterbacks; Reynolds, Green and Shible, halfbacks; Polwell, Edil, Laberwell, Hallanback and Bachman, fullbacks. The open style of play, invented by Dr. Carl Williams last season, will be continued this year with a few improvements.

With several husky giants out for preliminary practice at Columbia, the outlook does not appear so unfavorable as earlier in the season. Capt. Thorpe, who was on the look-out all summer for promising players, intimates that he has several good cards yet up his sleeve.
