NEWS OF THE STATE

A GREAT LAKES MARINER, Captain Turgeon, is in Bellingham at the present time, and will probably build or buy a new steamer for the Bellingham-Seattle route.

THE SUPERINTENDENT of the Post-Lumber mine, Andrew Ecklund, arrived in Bellingham from the mine Thursday with a cleanup which is reported to be about \$10,000.

THE CITY COUNCIL of Harrington has accepted the plans of Civil Engineer P. T. Byrne, of Spokane, for the proposed city sewer system, and maps and blue prints of the same have been ordered.

THE ANTI-TICKET SCALPER LAW passed by the last legislature was argued Thursday in Olympia in the state supreme court on an appeal from King county.

AFTER A TWO DAYS SESSION in Tacoma, F. Walden, of Seattle, was elected president of the Western Washington Christian Missionary society.

A BELLINGHAM BOY, Joe McAllister, was remanded to the superior court in Bellingham by Judge Williams Thursday for the malicious destruction of property. He must report to the court twice each month.

THE SUPREME COURT at Olympia Thursday heard a great many appeals. Among them was the appeal of Charles T. Terry against Jacob Furth, in which Terry seeks

to recover property in Seattle. ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of the executive committee of the Y. W. C. A. were filed Thursday with the secretary of state at Olympia.

Finally Agree on High School Sites

The school board Thursday, after two years' consideration of suitable sites for a district high school, decided to build the first of the three proposed structures in the district between Lake Union and Green lake. Within the next two years a second high school will be erected on a site procured Thursday on Queen Anne hill. The consideration paid for the site was \$22,500. This building will probably be built soon after the Interlake building.

"Bill" Sues For Rest of the Coin

"Swiftwater Bill" Gates Thursday commenced action in the superior court, in which he claims he can prove the charges against George B. Cole and John C. Murphy, which the bar association is now investigating, are true.

The suit is brought by Gates for the return of the remaining \$500 of the \$2,250 which was taken from him. "Bill" calls it a "hold-up."

HOLD ALL DAY New Scheme For Court House SESSIONS

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 26.—

The W. C. T. U. held all-day evangelistic services in the Trinity Methodist church today, conducted by Miss Eliza W. Greenwood, of New York.

The "Y" conference held an all-day session, led by Miss Cora E. Sabaret, of New York. The discussion was on the advisability of inserting a prohibition clause in the pledge. The conference agreed that more can be done by persuasion than by rule.

The first meeting of the Loyal Temperance Legion was held this afternoon, and a reception will be given this evening to visiting White Ribboners.

The convention opens tomorrow morning.

A new scheme of disposing of the courthouse has been suggested by George F. Cotterill, and has received a good deal of approval among local taxpayers.

The plan is to use the building for a county jail, criminal court and charity hospital, and to construct a combined city and county building on the Yealer block to accommodate the other courts and offices now in the court house.

It is pointed out that the relations of the criminal court, county jail and emergency hospital are such that it would be handy to have them all in the same building. All offices except the sheriff's would be removed to the new joint building. It is the location of these offices on the hill rather than that of the jail and criminal court, that causes so much inconvenience.

The scheme also contemplates the vacation of Jefferson street opposite the Yealer block and the erection of a public hall on the present city

hall site. This hall would be built out of the Osborne bequest of \$45,000. The executors of the latter are now disputing the right of the city to take the money, unless it be used for the construction of such an auditorium plainly marked "Osborne Hall," which was the specific object contemplated.

If the hall were built in this manner, all such objections would be removed, and there would be no danger of the city losing the money. The hall could be used for a council chamber, and room could be found in the building for various offices.




