

# WHEREABOUTS OF TELEGRAPH HUTS

### FIRST NEWS OF THE WRECK CAME FROM DESERTED TELEGRAPH STATION, A SHORT DISTANCE FROM POCHINA BAY

Telegraph huts, from which much of the news of the wrecked steamer Valencia has been received, and which was the first point reached by the boatload of survivors in the south of Pochina Bay, is about 100 miles from the high bluff point of Pochina Bay, a distance of about 100 miles from the wreck where definite news can be obtained. The lighthouse is situated on a small islet at the extremity of the cape, the easterly entrance to Barclay sound, is a square, painted white and showing a red lantern, 42 feet in height, and the signal is a flashing white light every half minute, showing from a height 175 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather for 19 1/2 miles. A red sector is shown from the light across the channel and Western reefs in the entrance to Barclay sound.

There is a fog alarm at Cape Beale and also at Carmanah, both of which are in operation during thick weather. Cape Beale is a bold, rocky point 120 feet high, with the top of the trees at places 300 feet above the surface of the water. Some rocks extend off the lighthouse rock from two to four cable lengths distant.
