

# TO ERECT BIG PLANT

### STONE & WEBSTER PLAN ELECTRIC GENERATING STATION AS WELL AS NEW CAR BARN AT GEORGETOWN—THE MILWAUKEE WANTS TO GO THROUGH SITE PURCHASED.

A 10,000 horse-power electric generating plant for emergency uses is to be erected at Georgetown by the Stone & Webster interests within the near future, as well as extensive car shops and car barns for the cars of the Seattle-Tacoma interurban line, and some of the city lines. The property for the plant has already been secured, being a triangular tract south of the brewery and between the Northern Pacific railroad and the Duwamish river, a portion of the Ada Blackwell tract.

#### Negotiations in Progress.

The Milwaukee railroad has run its surveys through the property and desires to secure a right-of-way through it for its line into Seattle. As the present owners have purchased the property for quasi-public use the Milwaukee will be unable to condemn a right-of-way through it, so if one is secured it will have to be by negotiations between the parties. These negotiations are now in progress.

The necessity for additional reserve electric power generating capacity for the Stone & Webster interests arises from the character of its plant at Electron, on which it depends for its water power current. The Electron plant was an expensive one, designed to generate some 18,000 initial horse power, but in some respects it has proven disappointing.

#### Mistakes Are Costly.

The water from the Puyallup river is carried to the reservoir in a long flume running along the mountain side. Before it was constructed the engineers in charge declared that this flume line would be free from damage by landslides, but nevertheless the flume line has been from time to time broken by

such slides. The engineers reported also that the water at that point did not freeze in winter, but in this respect also their plans have gone astray. During the present cold snap the company has been working every steam plant available to its capacity in the effort to keep up its current.

With its water power plant liable at any time to be cut off through accidents to the power transmission line, or disabled through damage to the flume or the lack of water, it is necessary for the company to have a large reserve steam plant capacity for the generation of current in emergencies.

#### Means Much to Georgetown.

When the car barns of the interurban have been established there it is anticipated that most of the trains will be started from Georgetown, thereby bringing to Georgetown a large number of trainmen on the line as permanent residents. The Blackwell tract, of which the site for the new power plant is a part, has for many years been the property of Ada Blackwell, having been presented to her as a little girl by one of the early settlers who filed on it as a government donation claim. The 40 acres which was secured by the Stone & Webster interests was purchased at \$1,000 an acre. The remaining portion of the tract is higher ground and some of it has been purchased recently for platting at \$500 an acre.

## ARE STILL SEARCHING

NO CLUE YET FOUND BY THE POLICE TO REMAINING MEMBERS OF THE CHINESE GANG THAT ROBBED FRANK LOUIS

With three of his assailants already in jail, the police are still searching for the remaining members of the gang of Chinese who waylaid Frank Louis on King street early yesterday morning and robbed him. Louis had prepared to take the steamer yesterday for San Francisco, but will now stay here until the case is settled.

Louis is an Americanized Chinese, having been born in Portland, and has never associated with his countrymen. He has adopted the American ways so thoroughly that he is Chinese only in nativity. He was living with a white woman, whom he says was his wife, until two weeks ago, when she suddenly decamped and went to San Francisco. He had prepared to follow her when the robbery occurred.

That there will be a hard legal battle to convict the Chinese under arrest for the crime is certain, as the local colony have joined together to pay an attorney to fight the case. Louis’ knowledge of Chinese and the fact that he is one by birth himself may make the prosecution a pleasant affair than if the prosecuting witness were a white man.
